Independence Day celebrates severing ties of the united thirteen colonies of America with England, the mother country, on July 4, 1776. It is interesting that each of us has our own independence day. The moment the obstetrician severs the umbilical cord in the delivery room, we are thrust into life independent of our mother. New birth, new life, and the illusion of independence. We soon come to realize that life requires participation with others. No human person can exist in exclusivity. Water, food, shelter, and socialization demand dependence in regard to availability of those items of Maslow's Pyramid of needs.

The illusion of independence places itself in juxtaposition to the reality of self-sufficiency. Just because I discover those life-sustaining elements, it is not a truth that I have created them. There is credit given to the resourcefulness and creativity of discovery, and a prioritization of them. Longevity can be in direct proportion to an individual's ability to ration. Animals often secure food and shelter to sustain them during long periods of winter hibernation. Gratitude and acknowledgement shall be extended to the actual provider/creator of those life-sustaining products. Separation from the false truth of total independence opens the door to freedom.


