Lent: A Call to Righteous Deeds



Venerable Brothers, the season of Lent is a preparation for the Easter celebration. It is a time to imitate Jesus spending forty days in the desert. Jesus fasted in the desert, and overcame the devil’s temptations (Lk.4:1-2). Lent is an invitation for us to take the courageous step of “going into the desert” and not hiding from what lies hidden deep within us. It is a period where we ought to allow our sins and weaknesses to come to the surface so that we can deal with them and allow them to be healed by the grace of God. It is only when we admit our sins that we will try to overcome them. If we remain in denial, we miss receiving the grace of God to heal us and to renew us and to make us whole. During Lent, Jesus teaches us to perform three righteous deeds—namely almsgiving, prayer, and fasting—but he warned us not to perform righteous deeds for the approval of the people (Mt.6:1). My sources of reference will be Canon Law 1249-1253, *The Pastoral Statement on Penance and Abstinence* issued by the US Bishops in 1966 and Pope Paul VI’s 1966 Apostolic Constitution *Paenitemini* .

Since the early centuries, the Church has suggested three things that we undertake during Lent: **prayer, fasting, and almsgiving**. It is for this reason that the Gospel text for Ash Wednesday every year is Jesus’ advice on prayer, fasting and almsgiving (Matt 6:1-6, 16-18). Fasting is a penance the Church encourages us to undertake. From the spiritual point of view, fasting symbolizes our dependence on God. It expresses the fact that we really are trying to put God first in our life. The Bible tells us that **fasting from food must go together with fasting from sin** (Isa 58:3-12). Fasting is a “spiritual exercise” by which we repent of our sins and strive to become more Christ-like as sons and daughters of God (Catechism of the Catholic Church, nos. 1438, 2043; cf. Rom. 8:14-17). While Jesus cautioned against prideful fasting (Mt. 6:1-5, 16-18), He Himself fasted (Mt. 4:1-10) and encouraged others to do so to advance His Kingdom (Mt. 17:21). From her inception, the Church has followed Christ’s example regarding fasting. She continues to require the faithful to fast and abstain on prescribed days during Lent. The Church encourages fasting, prayer, and almsgiving above all other forms of penance (Catechism, no. 1434; cf. 1438-39). The purpose of fasting is about interior conversion and transformation of life, as prophet Joel puts it in a nice way: “Rend your hearts, not your garments” (Joel 2:13). The prophet Isaiah elaborates on “acceptable” fasting, is a fasting of charity and love (Is. 58:1-12) .

Fasting and prayer have long been part of the Christian ascetic tradition. The two oldest extra-Biblical Christian documents we have, *The Didache* and *The Shepherd of Hermas*, both written around the end of the first century AD, mention the importance of fasting and prayer. Christians today are called to continue this tradition. Canon Law mandates that we have an obligation to do penance (Can. 1249). The church encourages her members to fast Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In recognition of ancient tradition, the early Church leaders prayed and fasted in commissioning St. Paul and Barnabas (Acts. 13:2-3; see also: 14:23). Christians were instructed to fast, but not like other Jews who fast on Monday and Thursday; they were to **fast on Wednesday and Friday**, in order to commemorate the Passion and death of Christ (Didache 1:1, 8:1) .

Let us examine some quotations from the Church Fathers. Following Pope Paul VI’s directive, the U.S. Bishops decreed in a November 1966 statement that traditional law of fast and abstinence on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and abstinence from meat on the Fridays of Lent must be maintained. Also the Bishops reaffirmed in 1991 that Friday remains a special day of penitential observance throughout the year, a time when those who seek perfection will be mindful of their personal sins and the sins of mankind, which they are called upon to help expiate in union with Christ Crucified. Friday should be, in each week, something of what Lent is in the entire year. For this reason, we urge all Catholics to prepare for that weekly Easter that comes with each Sunday by freely making of every Friday a day of self-denial and mortification in prayerful remembrance Christ’s Passion.

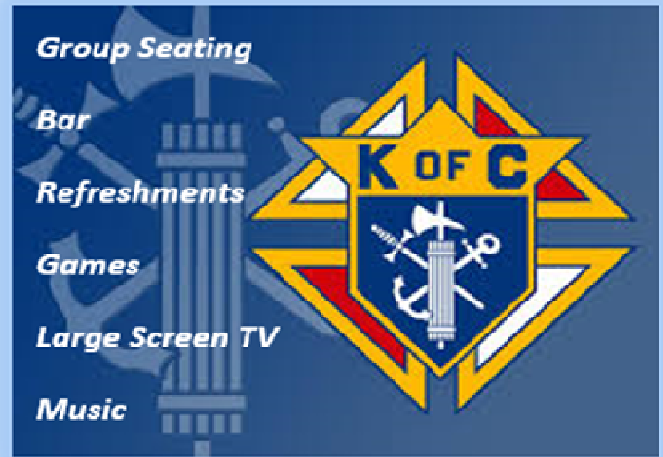

Lent: A Call to Righteous Deeds

Pope Paul VI called for local bishops' conferences to establish appropriate fasting norms. The 1966 US Bishops' *Pastoral Statement on Penance and Abstinence* contains many recommendations on observing penance. Regarding fasting in particular, the bishops "strongly recommend **participation in daily Mass** and a **self-imposed observance of fasting**" for "all weekdays of Lent" (para. 14). In *Paenitemini*, Pope Paul VI teaches that we are all called to do penance, but that we are each called to do it voluntarily, according to our state in life. A healthy young adult, a pregnant woman, a diabetic, and a person undergoing chemotherapy will all approach fasting differently. Some will not be able to fast at all. In the end, fasting is not about eating a certain amount of food, or consuming a certain number of calories. It's about self-denial, and it must be accompanied with prayer, if it is to be for our spiritual benefit.

In conclusion venerable Brothers, Lent is a period of improving our righteous deeds in order to attain God's blessings. Righteous deeds recommended to us are: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. In fact, fasting from food should be accompanied with fasting from sins. According to Isaiah, prayer and fasting are not genuine without reforming one's way of life. For a true social morality will ensure prosperity in the eyes of God. May God give us grace to give alms, to pray, and to fast from our heart, so that we will receive God's blessings. Amen!

For starters, we extend to each of our members an Accidental Death benefit for free, just by virtue of their membership in the Knights of Columbus. The program – which is only available in insurance jurisdictions – provides a benefit of \$1,000 - \$2,500 upon the accidental death of any member or his spouse (subject to certain age restrictions). The program was launched at the 113th Supreme Council Meeting in 1994, and has continued to the present day, providing more than \$12.5 million in benefits.

In addition to the Accidental Death benefit, the Knights of Columbus offer a number of free services to our members and their families. First and foremost, we agents are committed to providing survivor assistance to widows and families left behind after the loss of a loved one.

Most commercial agents would fill out the necessary paperwork and move on, but not Knights of Columbus agents. We will stand by you and help you contact your attorney to sort out the will, help you make funeral arrangements, help you notify and coordinate with the council, help resolve any financial matters, help you file any claims (including claims with companies other than the Knights of Columbus), and will help file for survivor benefits or Veteran's benefits, if necessary.

Secondarily, we offer two additional services to help Knights' families plan. The first is Profiles & Forecaster, a comprehensive and complimentary industry tool that helps you evaluate your family's financial situation, and to determine what insurance protection – if any – may be needed. The second, the Knights of Columbus Personal Planning Workbook, will help you record your final wishes and important information (including accounts, passwords, funeral arrangements, etc.) for your survivors. Both of these services are free. To our Owners,* we offer two additional programs: the Family Fraternal Benefit Program, and the Orphan Fraternal Benefit Program.

The Family Fraternal Benefit Program offers two distinct benefits. The first offers insurance eligibility to uninsurable children. Through the Program, a member can purchase a \$5,000 life insurance policy for an otherwise uninsurable child at standard rates before the child is 61 days old, or at a rated premium if before the child's 18th birthday. A member can also purchase a \$5,000 policy for a mentally impaired child at standard rates, between the ages of 3 and 18 years old.

The Program also offers death benefit coverage to members who have lost an infant child less than 61 days after birth, or who have lost an unborn child in a stillbirth, after the 20th week. (The Order affirms that life begins at conception. In this instance, the benefit requires a certified death certificate for the stillborn child, hence the 20-week rule.)

The second fraternal benefit program available to insured members is the Orphan Fraternal Benefit Program. This extensive program also provides two benefits. The first is an \$80 monthly benefit for each eligible orphan, until their 19th birthday. The second is a scholarship program, which grants eligible orphans up to \$1,750 per year for a four-year period.

In a letter addressing the programs, our Supreme Knight Carl Anderson noted that "These benefits augment the tradition of fraternity established by Father McGivney, namely, that the Order cares for its own; it expands upon a basic reason for which he founded the Order: 'of rendering pecuniary aid to its members, their families, and beneficiaries of members and their families.'" They are part of what makes us unique. So get to know all of our fraternal benefits, and the ways in which you may benefit from them. Contact me today to learn more.

**To be eligible for both the Family Fraternal Benefit Program, and the Orphan Fraternal Benefit Program, the member must be in good standing, and either he or his wife must be insured under a Knights of Columbus certificate requiring an annual premium of at least \$150, or providing at least \$5,000 in permanent life insurance coverage. Eligibility for the Orphan Fraternal Benefit Program is also contingent on the child being covered by an individual Knights of Columbus certificate.*
