Modernization and Senses of Sacred



As societies and nations are developing, people are gradually loosening senses of sacred. One thing we need to note is that in every religion there is a strong sense of **sacred and profane**. The more a person grows spiritually, the more he or she grows towards sacredness and develops a strong sense of do's and don'ts, in order to live well with the Supreme Being or God. The more a person declines in holiness, the weaker the person's senses of the supernatural or sacred is weakened, which translates in the person's attitudes towards do's and don'ts. The person becomes more profane and trivializes anything sacred and gradually loses his or her senses of sin. Talking about this subject, Pope John Paul II opines "the obscuring or weakening of the sense of sin comes from several sources: from a rejection of any reference to the transcendent in the name of the individual's aspiration to personal independence; from acceptance of ethical models imposed by general consensus and behavior, even when condemned by the individual conscience; from the tragic social and economic conditions that oppress a great part of humanity causing a tendency to see errors and faults only in the context of society… Pope John Paul II, Post Synodal Apostolic Exhortation, Reconciliatio et Poenitiae; 2n December,1984".

A careful examination of societies and nations show that many people are loosening senses of sacred and becoming more profane. The fact is that the greater a person senses of the sacred, the stronger the person's sense of sin and vice versa, because the senses of the sacred is intrinsically connected to the senses of sin. (Confer Isaiah 6: 1-5, I saw the Lord seated on a high and lofty throne...then I said, "woe is me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the king, the Lord of hosts!") Indeed, the acknowledgement of God's holiness goes with the acknowledgement of personal sins and the need for reconciliation and penance. Hence, to trivialize one is to trivialize the other. Any person who is sensitive to the presence of the sacred seeks to be purified from sins. Similarly, a person who is sensitive to the presence of sin seeks to be reconciled with God.

Venerable Brothers, let us look around our communities and Churches and see how fast our sense of the sacred is being weakened, if not lost. Reverence for sacred, which once marked the spirituality of the saints, is gradually fading away from our churches. How many of us bow or genuflect before the Blessed Sacrament upon entering the church? How many of us keep silence in and around the church? How many of us revere the Holy Bible? How many of us take Holy Hour or adoration of the Blessed Sacrament seriously? How many of us have horror for sin? How many times do we take advantage of the sacrament of reconciliation or confession ...?

In conclusion, dear friends, the development of societies and nations should help us to see the Creator than to run away from the Creator. According to St. Augustine, man is made to live in communion with God in whom he finds happiness... (St. Augustine, Conf.10,28,39; PL32,795). The fact is that God created us to know Him, to love Him and **to** serve Him. God did not create us to develop and forget Him. The more we develop the more we should acknowledge the Creator, but the tragedy is that people love created things more than they love the Creator. Another tragedy is that people tried to improved their standard of their living and forgot about their standard lives with the Creator. How can people develop and forget God? Maybe the Psalmist is right by saying: "In his riches, man lacks wisdom: he is like the beasts ..." Ps.49:21. God is calling all mankind to its original innocence, the knowledge of the sacred, which the Holy Bible calls: the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom (Proverbs 1:7; Ps.111:10. May God give us grace to maintain our baptismal innocence in order to use material things around us to know God, to love Him and to serve Him all the days of our lives. Amen!

Did You Know?	The Knights of Columbus served as guardians of one of America's most enduring symbols of American Freedom. In 1915 the Liberty Bell traveled from Philadelphia to San Francisco to be at the Panama-Pacific Exposition and it was guarded by three KofC Brothers who were police officer's in Philadelphia. Three other Brother Knights also served on the Committee of Councilmen that accompanied the Bell. The Orator for the Bell was a Brother Knight by the name of Joseph Gaffney. It was estimated that 10 million people saw the Liberty Bell during its' roundtrip travels. The Liberty Bell returned to Philadelphia under the watchful eyes of KofC Brothers and as remained there ever since.
