Christian Family as a Copy of the Holy Family



Venerable Brothers, many people are in positive expectancy for the New Year, and every 31 December, they gather in prayer waiting for a new year with higher hopes. Roman Catholic Christians, normally, attend vigil Masses to pray to God for His blessings. Also, in many Protestant churches, Christians are celebrating their vigil called Cross Over to the New Year. A final group, non-Christians, prefer to welcome the New Year with large parties. Regardless of the approach, the year will not be new if our focus does not center around creating a New You in the New Year. We can make the year a New You by changing our bad habits and by surrounding ourselves with positive people doing positive things. Otherwise, the year is going to be the same 365 or 366 days, the weeks are going to be the same, and the months are going to be the same. The fact is that you can make the year a New You by trying a new personality and lifestyles. It is only when you change the people around you are going to experience a New You.

In the study of spirituality, we were told that in order to acquire virtues, we need to practice the opposite of our vices. For example, if you have strong hatred toward someone, you must try to love the fellow and by so doing you become virtuous. If you are always fighting with your wife, you need to do is to practice the virtue of patience by so doing you and your wife can live peaceful in one house. If you are a liar and you want to overcome lying, all that you need to do is trying to tell the truth so that gradually you become a sincere person. If you see beautiful women and you cannot control yourself when you are about to see one, close your eyes and save yourself from trouble. Although the beautiful women will always cross your path, you will overcome them by praising God for the beauty of creation rather than sensual qualities. The fact is that you cannot stop birds flying over your head, but you can avoid looking at them. If you are a selfish person, try to practice the virtue of generosity and very soon you will become a new person altogether. Before Nelson Mandela left prison, he said something which I think it is good for acquisition of virtue: "As I stand the door to my freedom, I realized that if I do not leave behind my pain, bitterness and anger, I will still be in prison." Self-imprisonment is worse than that imposed. How many are in self-inflicted pains today for lack of forgiveness? How many of us have imprisoned ourselves inside the walls of anger and bitterness? Holding grudges does not make you strong, rather weak and bitter. Forgiveness does not make us weak, rather sets us free. Dear brothers, consider ourselves fortunate that we can change for the better so that the year 2019 will be a happy New You, not only a New Year. I think Nelson Mandela has set the pace for us to follow. Many people praised Mandela for coming out of the prison as a new person, and we also can be a good example for others to follow. Let your friends see you this year as a new person, so that they can greet you as wow happy New You!

As Christians, our upper most best is the growth in virtuous life because any time we are in sin, we are retrogressing. To become a New You, St. Paul opines, "For our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed; the night is advanced, the day is at hand. Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day, not orgies and drunkenness, not in promiscuity and licentiousness, not in rivalry and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ (be holy), and make no provision for the desires of the flesh" (Rom.13:11-14).

Finally, dear friends, on this New Year, we have gathered together to entrust ourselves to God's care and pray for ourselves, our dear ones, and the world as a whole. It is in doing so that the Lord's face will shine upon us and be gracious to us with his blessings of peace (Num.6; 25). God has given us 365/366 days; let us manage our time well and change our bad character and habits, so that it will be a New You rather than a New Year.
