The Holy Trinity: An Icon of Faith and Imitation

Brother Knights, I want us to reflect on the central mystery of our faith, "the Most Holy Trinity as an Icon of faith and model to be imitated." The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith. God alone can make it known to us by revealing himself as the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit (CCC.261). Although the term "Trinity" cannot be found in the Bible, the basic doctrine of Trinity is firmly rooted in the Bible. The term Trinity could be understood in two perspectives, namely: the history of salvation and the development of Catholic faith or Christian faith.

Trinity unfolds to us through the whole history of salvation, after the fall of Adam and Eve (Gen. 3:8-19), and the mission of the Messiah (the Son of God) and the Holy Spirit (cf. AG 2-9; CCC.250; Mt. 28:19). After the fall of Adam and Eve (Gen. 3:8-19) and the proliferation of sin in the world, God planned to redeem man from the dominion of darkness into his own wonderful light. The promise of the Messiah has been necessitated due to Israel turning its back to God, and the typical example is the Prophet Isaiah 1:2-5, who compares the people of Israel with ox and ass, the animals proverbially known for their stupidity and stubbornness, to underline Israel's failure to respond to God. God himself promised to give the house of David a sign...the virgin shall be with child, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel, which means God is with us (Is. 7:14, Mt. 1:23, Mic. 5:2...). Christians see the incarnation of Jesus Christ as the ultimate expression of God's willingness to "be with us" and that Isaiah 7:14 has been interpreted as the fulfilment of the birth of Jesus Christ, the Messiah.

Gradually, the Holy Trinity revealed to us at the baptism of Jesus "after Jesus was baptized, he came up from the water and behold, the heavens were opened [for him], and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove [and] coming upon him. And a voice came from the heaven, saying "this is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." (Mt. 3:17). The Trinity appeared again as a bright cloud... and the voice of the Father saying: "this is my beloved Son; with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." (Mt. 17:5). The voice repeats the baptismal proclamation about Jesus, with the addition of the command listen to him. The latter is a reference to Dt. 18:15, in which the Israelites are commanded to listen to the prophet like Moses whom God will raise up for them. Also, towards the end of Jesus' ministry he introduced the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of truth, who will come to guide us to the all truth (Jn. 16:13). Finally, Trinity is seen in Jesus' last teaching to his disciples saying: "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit (Mt. 28:18-19).

As you can see from the history of salvation, the church developed her belief in God the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and called them Holy Trinity. The doctrine of the Trinity is not a "top down" theology that began with Augustine's or Thomas Aquinas' apostolic writings, such as the following salutation taken up in our Eucharistic liturgy found in a few biblical references: **the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all** (2 Cor. 13:13; 1 Cor. 12:4-6; and Eph. 4:4-6). Another, most influential NT texts seen as implying the teaching of the Trinity is Matthew 28:19, which mandated baptizing "In the name of the Father, and of the son, and of the Holy Spirit." In fact, in baptism, we are called to share in the life of the Holy Trinity on earth in faith. Trinity Sunday is a day for the church to celebrate how she understands God and how she lives out her understanding.

In the early centuries, the Church sought not only to **clarify its Trinitarian faith, but also to deepen her understanding of the faith** and to defend against the errors that were deforming it. This clarification was the work of the early **Councils**, aided by the theological work of the **Church Fathers**. According to theologians, God made Himself known to us out of **love** and in order to **redeem mankind**. For God loved the world so much that he gave his only son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but have eternal life (Jn. 3:16). God created us and loves us, as our Father. As the Son, God came into the world to share his life with us. Jesus, in the Gospel, tells us that when the Spirit of truth comes, He will guide us to all truth (Jn. 16:13). In other words, God reveals Himself as the Holy Spirit, who gives us new life as children of God and who causes the Trinity to dwell within our hearts that is what Paul is telling us that **the love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit** (Rom. 5:5).

In conclusion venerable Brothers, the Holy Trinity is a mystery that cannot be explained in a rational term, but a mystery to be experienced. It is a sanctifying and mysterious presence of God. One way to think about Trinity is that we all make the Sign of the Cross every time we pray. So what are we really doing when we make the sign of the Cross? We're expressing our faith in the Trinity. Let me end with this sociological dimension of the Trinity. If the Holy Trinity lives in perfect unity, love, and equality, then whenever you make the sign of the cross ask yourself, what is my relationship with the person in front of me, the person behind me, the person on my right side, and the person on my left side? If your relationship with one another is deepened with love, unity, and equality, then we are close to Holy Trinity, but if we are not then, you have more room for improvement.




