📙 The Two Ways

Venerable Brothers, I want us to meditate on two ways proposed to us by the wisdom of God: a way to life and a way to death; a way to virtue and a way to sin... The Book of Psalms begins with the life of blessedness and the life that leads to final damnation. In fact, Psalm 1 is sets as a preface to the whole Book of Psalms, contrasting with striking similes the destiny of good

and the bad. The Psalm views life as an activity, as choosing either the good or the bad. Each "way" brings its inevitable consequences. The wise through their good actions will experience eternal life, while the wicked portion is death. Moses, the servant of the Lord, also proposed to the Chosen people in the Book of Deuteronomy. Chapter 30:15-20, to make a right

Moses, the servant of the Lord, also proposed to the Chosen people in the Book of Deuteronomy, Chapter 30:15-20, to make a right judgment. "See, I have today set before you life and good, death and evil. If you obey the commandments of the Lord, your God, which I am giving you today... you will live and grow numerous, and the Lord, your God, will bless you in the land you are entering to possesses. I call heaven and earth today to witness against you. I have set before you life and death, the blessing and the curse. Choose life, then, that you and your descendants may live...". Dear friends, the admonishing of Moses is for all of us who call ourselves Christians. We live in a culture that is constantly filled and refilled with images of violence, death and temptations as Pope Saint John Paul II spoke often of the "culture of death" so prevalent in the world today. God is entreating all of us to choose life any time, whenever we reach a crossroad to make a choice. Life is what God is encouraging us to choose. Think about the choices you make each day. Choices you make on your own life, on your family, work and so on and so forth, are they choices that bring life or death?

In addition, Jesus, our Lord, preached about the need to choose a good way of life by recommending the famous saying "enter by the narrow gate". Matthew 7:13-14 "Enter by the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is easy, that leads to destruction…" According to The Navarre Bible commentary, the verb "Enter" in the Matthew's Gospel often has as its object the "Kingdom of heaven". Therefore, the verb "enter" should be interpreted as an imperious invitation to the Kingdom of heaven. The way of sin is momentarily pleasant and calls for no effort, but it leads to eternal perdition. Following the way of a generous and sincere Christian life is very demanding – here Jesus speaks of a narrow gate a hard way-but it leads to Life, to eternal salvation.

Finally, Venerable Brothers, let us devote a few minutes each day before we sleep to examine the lifestyle we have chosen or we want to choose and also pray for enlightenment from the Holy Spirit to make an informed decision guarded by the Holy Spirit. Brothers life passes so quickly that we ought to think more of how to die than how to live. Again, 'in all your works remember your last end and you shall never sin' (Eccl.7:40). "A prudent man sees evil and hides himself, but the naïve proceed and pay the penalty" (Prov.27:12).

May God give us grace to see evil ahead and lead a holy and blameless life all the days of our lives. Amen!




