Knights of Columbus Online Membership

The K of C has launched an Online Membership program that as of July 2018 is available to all eligible Catholic men in the U.S. and Canada.

Pilot program launch:

• Beginning on Aug. 10, 2017, the Online Membership pilot launched in the Jurisdictions of Alberta, Maryland and New Mexico. In October, the pilot program expanded. By July 1, 2018, online membership was available throughout Canada and the U.S. (with the exception of Puerto Rico).

Online member v. council member:

- Online members are associate members who belong to a local state division.
- Council members belong to a local council, having gone through a council's first degree admissions process.

Online membership benefits—for \$30/year, online members receive:

- Subscription to Columbia, the K of C's leading Catholic magazine.
- Exclusive eligibility to purchase life insurance, long-term care insurance, and disability income insurance, as well as retirement products from the K of C.
- Access to a wealth of online resources.
- Direct connection to a local and global network that offers endless opportunities to get involved and make a difference.
- The opportunity to join a local council serving parishes and communities in their area.

Progress:

- As of July 15, more than 2,500 men have joined the Order online.
- The average age of online members is 42.
- Sixty-three percent of online members have indicated a desire to join a local council.

Purpose:

- K of C's Online Membership allows eligible Catholic men to join through a streamlined process: visit kofc.org/join.
- It is a key part of the Order's long-term growth strategy.
- It provides modern men an opportunity to engage with the Knights through his entire life.
- It is a first step in joining the Knights of Columbus, allowing men to transfer to council-based membership at a later date.

Long-Term Care Awareness Month



As Thanksgiving approaches at the end of the month, I like to take stock of all the things I'm thankful for.

It is easy to say family and friends; those are blessings, and we sometimes take them for granted...but how about the little things in life. It might be that smile you get from person who hands you your cup of coffee in the morning, it may be relishing the crisp air on an autumn day. It may be a simple stroll in the park marveling at God's nature abounding. Maybe the joy of helping an older neighbor with a chore. All little things to be thankful for.

When I think about helping older neighbors, I often wonder just how many members have taken advantage of help that they might need as they age. Some won't be able to do the simple activities of daily living. They'll need assistance, and with our mobile society may not have a relative nearby to help. That's where our Knights of Columbus Long Term Care Insurance plan might help.

Many people don't know how a long-term care insurance policy helps cover the costs of care when the policy holder has a chronic medical condition, a disability, or a disorder such as Alzheimer's disease. You can receive care in your home, a nursing home, an assisted living facility, or an adult day care center.

This is an average for the Hampton Roads area. Of course, there are more expensive areas of the country. Without LTC insurance many families would face a serious financial crisis.

Most people aren't eager to talk about long term care; but it's important to have a plan. Many people want to wait until they are in their 60s or 70s before they start to consider long term care. But at younger ages it's more likely you can qualify...and the price is less expensive when you're younger.

Are you a Doer or a Complainer?



How would you feel if you were speaking to me and I didn't hear you? Would it bother you? Would you even care? Well, that is the question you have to ask yourself during this year's election time. Are you aware of the many changes that have gone on in the last 50 years? Are you aware of what is going on, even in our communities today? So many of us are fixated on the national picture that we fail to look at our local government. I remember one day I was driving to North Carolina and I had some family members in my car, and somehow voting came up. I was truly amazed at the comments mentioned. I heard things like "why should I vote, it won't matter," "the person in the office does what they want," "politicians don't listen to the people," etc. Initially I was shocked, but what was more shocking was when I heard that voting was a waste of time. Wow, what a shock, but after speaking to others I began to hear that a lot. People will complain about how our government is divided and no one is listening to the people, yet many of them didn't even take the time to vote. So, are you are doer or a complainer?

In previous articles I wrote about being a proud member of the Knights of Columbus. I believe we can always make a difference. Many people feel, why vote when you are just one person among millions? As a Knight, you should care about your future and want the best things for your family, friends, the community, and the environment. You should vote in every election. Your inaction can have long-lasting ramifications that are hard to overcome. That's why what happens on Election Day is highly significant. All we really have is the present moment. Yes, every election matters. But no election matters more than the current one.

As Knights, we represent the Catholic Church and people look at us for direction and guidance. We always lead from the front. We are not closet knights, nor do we put our heads in the sand. Be proud and stand proudly. When you vote, you are vocalizing what you need, want, and believe in. You are standing up and demanding to be counted. By voting, you improve your chances of getting a government that actually represents you, your values, and your interests. Are you concerned about any of these: college affordability, health care, immigration, gun control, criminal justice, reproductive rights, taxes, foreign policy, religious activities? Then we need to your vote. Our society is in a turmoil and we need your voice to help our communities to see the benefits of our beliefs.

Some people become so cynical about the state of the world and never vote. They think, "Why should people vote when everything is so messed up? What's in it for me?" It's a self-defeating attitude that feeds upon itself and does nothing but perpetuate more of the "mess" they complain about. Here's the deal: You can either be a proactive knight of positive change or a passive knight of your own boring pessimism.

Yes, change can be slow. Lasting change usually is. It takes time for progress to happen, for enough people to see a certain vision and get on board with it. But if you never vote for people who support that vision, it's hard to believe you actually care about it. There is simply no integrity in complaining about something if you don't make the effort to change it. So try voting, even if you don't feel like it. You might just discover that you feel more positive about the future when you participate with others to make things better. We are depending on you to do the right thing. Your vote can help stop injustice. It can also help lift others up or keep them out of harm's way. Voting gives you the opportunity to amplify the voices of those who desperately want and need to be heard. You can't count on future elections to correct the bad things that may result from the current one. And you certainly can't count on other people voting the way you expect or want them to. Be a Knight we can be proud of.

Remember, We Care, therefore We Vote!
