

### **Life Insurance Awareness Month**



September is Life Insurance Awareness Month. McGivney again] spent his energy in promoting the insurance feature...his emphasis on business was his pastoral concern for the social and financial security of the family."

Fr. McGivney lived both the social and the financial insecurity of a desperate family, with the breadwinner suddenly taken, that had to be supported. He left the seminary to work and support his mother and siblings. He didn't want other Catholic families to find themselves in such a predicament. That, and uniting men of faith, was the impetus for establishing our Order. Everyone who joined in those first years was insured; that was part of being in the organization. Now every member has a choice and every member should know what we do, and how we do it. Here's the process we use when we meet with families:

- 1. Discover identify and prioritize your financial goals
- 2. Gather Data collect facts and figures based on your current situation
- 3. Analyze input data, run calculations, identify shortfalls
- 4. Recommend propose a financial strategy designed to satisfy your goals
- 5. Implement choose a financial strategy and implement
- 6. Periodic Review review regularly, measure success, make adjustments
