



# Grand Knight's Report

Dear Brothers,



Neither of these burdens is light, and they cannot be borne in solitude. As the world's largest Catholic lay organization, the Knights of Columbus is uniquely suited to serve as a source of strength and support for Catholic men as they strive to stand as strong, spiritual leaders for their family in the face of the great temptations and deprivations of our age. This makes it essential that we keep a focus on recruiting young family men into our ranks, both for the continued viability of the order and (more importantly) so that these young men have the support they need to be good Catholic husbands and fathers.

Similarly, as the number of faithful, Catholic families continues to decrease there is an ever increasing hunger for establishing a nurturing community among those families, a hunger that we see clearly within our own parish. Writing in the Cathedral bulletin on July 12<sup>th</sup>, Fr Steiner related his frustrations at the lack of participation in parish social activities such as the Fashion Shop & Show or our own St Patrick's Day event, even as the recent Parish Survey revealed a strong desire for more family and youth programming.

In response to this clear need, our theme for the 2015 - 2016 Fraternal Year will be *The Family Fraternal*, as we take our inward focus on *Fraternal Renewal* and expand it to encompass building and strengthening the community of families throughout the parish. This theme will be reflected in our programming as we redirect away from more formal, adult oriented events (particularly as the San Gennaro committee and its offshoots have this niche well covered) in favor of filling in the gaps in Cathedral's programming for daytime bring-the-kids events. Indeed, we have already had great success in co-hosting a pancake breakfast with the Boy Scouts, have a big Back to School Shrimp Boil planned in partnership with the Cathedral Day School and are looking at co-hosting future pancake breakfasts with other youth groups.

I am very excited for what we have planned for this year, and I hope that everyone will take their time to read through this newsletter and find at least one program of interest in which to get involved.


## Fraternal Interest Survey
