Dear Brothers,

Happy Easter! I pray that you and your families are being richly blessed as we journey through this most holy Easter season. It is, of course, a bittersweet celebration for our council this year, as we lost our dear friend and brother Stephen Penton on Easter Sunday following a short and very private battle with cancer. It is bitter in that we miss him dearly, and yet it is sweet as we share in his joy as he worships in this season of the Resurrection at the throne of the Risen One himself.

There is also a great fraternal joy that we can share with Stephen. As everyone knows he very much loved being a Knight, and if you were at our March council meeting you know that Stephen was one of five candidates from 544—along with Dave, Roy, Jeff, and myself—committed to participate in the Fourth Degree on March 12th. The Fourth is the highest degree in our order, and the annual ceremony is an epic day of formalities and pageantry that cannot be forgotten by anyone who has witnessed it. Every one of us was thrilled at this opportunity, but when the day arrived Stephen was already too ill to attend. The degree went on, setting a state record of 81 candidates, but all of us from 544 were keenly aware that record should have been 82.

As Stephen's health markedly declined heading into Holy Week, word spread and an effort was launched to fulfil Stephen's desire. On Holy Thursday, the Fourth Degree team put their own busy lives and Holy Week obligations on hold and travelled back into Nashville just two weeks after their record setting degree ceremony. And in Stephen's tiny ICU room, in an abbreviated ceremony attended by a small contingent of 544's Sir Knights, Stephen was inducted into the Fourth Degree.

This is the beauty of the Knights. We are an order that follows the example of the Good Shepherd, not satisfied with the 99 (or the 81), but instead compelled to go in search of the one who is lost. The one who is alone. The one who is ill.

I am often asked why I am a Knight. This is the reason.






## Seminarian Dinner

Fourth Degree Ceremony March 12, 2016




## General Agent's Report
