



Dear Brothers,



A few years ago, however, as I spent some time reflecting on the penitential and preparatory nature of Advent, it occurred to me that resolutions are an important aspect of our faith life. After all, if we "resolve to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid the near occasion of sin" as an essential part of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and if we resolve to take on some mortification or discipline for the penitential seasons of Advent and Lent, then why shouldn't we make annual resolutions as part of our faith life, especially if those resolutions ultimately bring us closer to God?

Over the next four weeks we will be preparing ourselves to receive Him who came "to make all things new." As we eagerly seek the renewal that the Christ child brings, I ask that you join me in praying that He will reveal to each of us the path to renewal that we should seek in our own lives. It may be something as simple as adding a weekday Mass to your schedule, as essential as returning to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, or as ambitious as seeking out a spiritual director. In this year dedicated to the *Family Fraternal*, perhaps it is something as fundamental as a resolution to take your kids for ice cream once a month, or as practical as meeting with your Field Agent to find out how you can protect your family for the long term. Whatever the resolution, I challenge each of us to take on one thing in this new year that will draw us closer to Christ. We are all parts of the same body, and what profits one profits all regardless of whether your particular resolution guides you to the privacy of the confessional or to a more public role in Columbianism.

And about those New Year's traditions: *Auld Lang Syne* came to the holiday in 1929 via Guy Lombardo, the ball drop started in 1907, and baby New Year traces to the 19th century. Those pesky resolutions? Turns out that the tradition goes back at least to the ancient Babylonians, a full five millennia before there was a Times Square. It seems it is a tradition worth preserving after all.

Sunday, November 15th kicked off our fifth annual See's Candy fundraiser. See's has been selling high quality old fashioned candy since 1921, and their name is well-known and respected. You can buy the same candy at the malls, but buying from your parish Knights of Columbus saves you the 9.25 % sales tax and you contribute to the many charities the Cathedral supports.



The Christmas season is the number one time of the year for candy sales. It tops Easter, Mother's Day, and Valentine's Day. So it is a great opportunity to buy some candy for yourself, family, friends, neighbors, and co-workers. To make the sales effort, all you have to do is ask. If every brother knight will buy at least one box of candy, we will easily exceed our goal of a 30% increase. Or if you bought a box last year, buy one more or get someone else to do so. Last year we sold 212 boxes.

Sales will take place at the Fleming Center after both morning masses November 15, 22, and 29. We will have candy on hand for immediate delivery or you can custom order for pick up on December 13 or 20 at the same place. Payment must be made with order and we will accept check, cash, or credit card. It's a fun way to raise some money for good causes and interact with your friends and fellow parishioners as well.

We booked a house on Airbnb and bought tickets for the WMOF. We shared our plans with Fr. Maxi of St. Matthew Catholic Church in Franklin and he opted to join us.

So fast forward to Monday September 21^{st.} We packed the minivan adorned with window paint and started the 14 hour journey to Philly at 4:30 AM. Understand that the family dynamic changes when there's a priest on board and we did our best to behave with respect. I guess you could say that Fr. Maxi got a real taste of family life on that 14 hour ride.



On Tuesday morning we registered for the WMOF conference along with 14,000 others. Each family member received a KofC logo backpack loaded with goodies and information. It was easy to spot conference attendees with their Knights of Columbus gear as you walked the streets of Philly. Almost as easy as spotting one of the 100 plus Nashville Dominicans that were in Philly attending both the WMOF and the Papal Mass!

After listening to Bishop Robert Barron in one session and Dr. Scott Hahn in another we cruised the exhibit hall. The largest exhibit among the hundreds of exhibitors was the Knights of Columbus (next to EWTN) booth that was well staffed and attractive. The WMOF conference ended on Friday and was followed by the "Festival of Families", an event where Pope Francis made a wonderful speech about the importance of family. On Sunday we enjoyed talking with Catholic families as we waited in excitement for the 2ndPapal parade at 3:15 PM followed by the Papal Mass at 4:00 PM. Pope Francis didn't disappoint as he cruised by



us and circled the crowds at the Benjamin Franklin Parkway. Our Fr. Maxi was near the alter and was one of the hundreds of priests who processed out with communion, many accompanied by a Knight of Columbus.

It was a very special week and an experience that none of us will ever forget. I am grateful for our Catholic faith, our Holy Father, my family and my brothers in the Knights of Columbus. Thank you for letting me share this experience.
