Greetings Brothers,


With the first quarter of our fraternal year behind us, our council has already made great progress in *Fraternal Renewal* and *Membership Growth*, which are our focus areas for this fraternal year. We have had three very successful fraternal events with our Fraternal Night at the Sounds, our Corporate Communion, and the General Jackson Cruise. More importantly we have strengthened the bonds of brotherhood through service, working side by side on many projects in support of the parish and the diocese. In the last three months alone, over two dozen of our 544 brothers have volunteered more than 160 hours of their time. In the growth category, we have welcomed several transfer members and already have some strong new member prospects for our Membership Blitz.

As we continue to pursue Fraternal Renewal in our council, let us never forget that the fraternity we seek as Knights is but an extension of the brotherhood of all Christians, rooted in the person of Christ who is made physically present in the Eucharist. In his encyclical *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, Pope Saint John Paul II writes: "The gift of Christ and his Spirit which we receive in Eucharistic communion superabundantly fulfils the yearning for fraternal unity deeply rooted in the human heart; at the same time it elevates the experience of fraternity already present in our common sharing at the same Eucharistic table..." In short, as a Catholic fraternal order, the strength of our fraternity can only come through our devotion to that which is "the source and summit of the Christian life." Indeed, with this understanding we see that when our Supreme Knight calls it a "moral obligation" for us to offer every Catholic man the opportunity of membership, is not a bold or presumptive statement. For if we are truly an order that builds its fraternity not merely from human social bonds, but instead draws on the example and presence of Christ as we seek to strengthen the faith and protect the families of our members, then should we not be compelled to offer those benefits to every man? Not every man is called to be a Knight of Columbus, but we cannot take the chance that anyone miss the opportunity simply because he was not asked.

With this in mind, our primary focus for the month of October is on Membership Growth. We have our Membership Blitz and Open House (pg. 3) for which we have set the ambitious goal of recruiting 12 new members to our council. If every active member brought in just one prospect, we could hit that goal with ease. We owe it to our Catholic brothers to offer them the opportunities that Knighthood has to offer, and we owe it to our parish to grow our council so that we can continue to run a full schedule of effective service programs for the benefit of the parish and the community. I am asking every member to contribute to this membership drive, whether it be through volunteering, bringing in a new prospect, or (most importantly) through prayer.

Amendment 1 - Vote YES on 1 on November 4

Will Amendment 1 ban abortion in Tennessee?

The amendment restores the Tennessee Constitution to where it was prior to the 2000 Tennessee State Supreme Court decision by making the constitution neutral on the question of abortion. Abortion would not be banned and remains legal across the United States due to the *Roe v. Wade* United States Supreme Court decision in 1973

What is the current abortion law in Tennessee?

Although Tennessee has historically been a national leader in the passage of protective, pro-life legislation, the TN Supreme Court stripped away many of these protections with its finding of a fundamental right to abortion in our state Constitution on September 15, 2000. As a result, abortion policy in Tennessee has become basically 'abortion on demand.'

Why is a constitutional amendment necessary?

With the Tennessee Supreme Court finding that the Tennessee Constitution provides a fundamental right to abortion, any laws which are interpreted to impact a "fundamental" right must be very narrowly written as to avoid infringing on the protected right. As Justice William Barker pointed out in his dissent, only by amending the Constitution can pro-life Tennesseans hope to positively influence public policy again. (See Barker Dissent, Section II)

How does the Amendment process work?

The language must be approved by 50% of those casting a vote in the Governor's race plus 1.

How exactly does Amendment 1 read?

Nothing in this constitution secures or protects a right to abortion or requires the funding of an abortion. The people retain the right through their elected state representatives and state senators to enact, amend, or repeal statutes regarding abortion, including, but not limited to, circumstances of pregnancy resulting from rape or incest or when necessary to save the life of the mother.
