



#### MY TWO CENTS from Fr. Don

May is traditionally known as the "Month of Mary." We have lost some of the traditions once part of this month but Mary's role in salvation should never be lost.

Mary. Two points that help us explain to non-Catholics (and, sadly to some Catholics as well!) why we honor Mary.

That was the first point...we "honor" Mary, not worship her. When the angel Gabriel appeared to Mary, it marked the one and only time that heaven praised a human being when first appearing to them. The angel Gabriel said, "Hail, Mary!" Every other time an angel appears to a human being in the Bible, the angel first says, "Do not be afraid!" So, if messengers from Heaven honor Mary...we should too! The first half of the Hail Mary prayer is rooted in the words of Gabriel, not man made.

Second, when we look into the sky...how do we know there is a moon? Often, we say, "the moon is bright tonight!" That may be true but the moon is NOT the SOURCE of the brightness. The sun is! The SON is! The only way we know there is a moon is that it REFLECTS the sun. Mary's role in every mention of her in Scripture is to RE-FLECT her SON. That is why on many statues of Mary, she has the moon under her feet. It is also mentioned in the book of Revelation (chapter 12).

Those are just two of the many reasons Mary is such an important part of our faith life as Catholics. Remember her, the rest of this month, and may we all strive to REFLECT the SON!
