

Bishop Mitchell Rozanski Blesses 10th MD State K of C Ultrasound Machine Source: MD State Council Bulletin (APR-2014)



On March 14 Bishop Rozanski attended the dedication ceremony of the 10th ultrasound machine the Knights of MD have raised money to purchase. This machine was donated the CPC Arbutus on January 31, 2014. It was the result of a collaborative, fund raising effort of all the councils of the Baltimore Chapter of Grand Knights. Bishop Rozanski opened the Dedication Ceremony with prayer a Reading of the Word, which was very inspirational. The Center Director, Allison Benson, who is not Catholic, commented "Wow! He gets it. He was right on about our purpose with the reading."

Chapter Treasurer, Joe Herman (2942), also the Chapter Pro-Life Chairman has facilitated and encouraged the councils to be involve in the fund raising at their monthly meetings. Significant donations for this machine were made by the councils of District 4, which donated \$5,000 from a Blob's Park German Festhaus Night; the councils of District 1, which donated \$4,000 from a Shrimp and Bull Roast and Our Lady of Mt Carmel Council 2452, which held a 4-weekend Baby Bowl-a-thon at Perry Hall Lanes and raised \$1,400. Many other councils made donations to the State Sonogram Fund to help, ranging from \$50 to \$500.

This ultrasound machine is portable which not only allows the center to help distressed mothers see the life within them, but it also allows them to take the machine to the High Schools and Colleges in the area to give health seminars to the young men and women. The machine can be connected to a big screen in the schools and the clarity is spectacular! It opened the floor for many questions, some that would make a man blush, according to the CPC Nurse/Sonographer, Kate Plaute. They have even been to two "Public" Schools already which is a major accomplishment! The efforts Pro-Life organizations throughout the State of Maryland are making a difference and the Knights of Columbus are a beacon light leading the way with our ultrasound machines.

# Order Supports Celebrations in Three U.S. Cities and Rome for Popes' Canonizations

On Sunday, April 27, 2014, the Knights of Columbus sponsored major U.S. celebrations coinciding with the canonizations of Pope John Paul II and Pope John XXIII in Washington, D.C.; New Haven, Conn.; and Los Angeles. In Rome, the Knights lent financial support to Vatican television's broadcast of the canonization ceremony, and hosted numerous pilgrims at K of C facilities.

"These two saints have each left very important legacies for the Church, and important examples of holiness for all of us," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson, who worked with Pope John Paul II over the years on a number of projects, and was in Rome for the canonizations. "Pope John XXIII led the Church into the Second Vatican Council, and Pope John Paul II served as its key interpreter, leaving the Church a profound legacy that continues to shape the third millennium of Christianity."

In Rome, the Order provided nearly \$100,000 to support Vatican Television's (CTV's) broadcast of the canonizations. In addition, the Knights opened two of its sports fields in Rome to give a thousand pilgrims – primarily from Poland – a place to camp for the canonizations. In Washington, D.C., the Knights hosted a series of celebratory events at our National Shrine of Pope John Paul II beginning Saturday, April 26. The program included a live, late-night simulcast of the canonization from Rome as well as liturgies, times of prayer, and veneration of a blood relic of John Paul II. In one of the weekend's highlights, the facility was renamed the Saint John Paul II National Shrine in a ceremony on Sunday, April 27, just hours after the canonization.

In New Haven, the Knights of Columbus Museum was the end point for a procession that began at St. Stanislaus Church following a prayer service at the parish at 3PM on Sunday, April 27. The service and procession featured a relic of John Paul II: a fragment of the pope's bloodstained cassock from the 1981 attempt on his life. The relic is on loan from the John Paul II Shrine in Washington. The museum also offered video presentations on the lives of the two new saints, children's activities, and a talk on the new saints in the days surrounding the canonizations.

In Los Angeles, the Knights were a major sponsor of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles' celebration at Our Lady of the Angels Cathedral on the evening of April 26. The vigil began with a rosary and testimonials from people whose lives have been changed by Pope John Paul II. There were also musical tributes by noted Catholic artists including Tony Melendez, who played for the Pope during his visit to Los Angeles in 1987. More at:




