Dear Brother Knights:

I hope that you had a joyous Easter celebrating the risen Lord and we remain in the Easter season until Pentecost so we continue to recognize Christ in our lives every day. As this Columbian year starts to wind down, we have to continue to keep membership efforts in full swing until the very last day of the year. With that in mind, and focusing on every council achieving Star Council, Supreme has announced the following incentive program:

STAR COUNCIL INCENTIVE - Councils that earn the Star Council Award in the 2018-2019 fraternal year will receive a \$4.50 credit for each billable member on their roster as of July 1, 2019.

Starting on April 1, Supreme announced another Membership incentive that has states going head to head:

<u>Membership Tournament Challenge –</u>

Win cash for your jurisdiction. Win bragging rights for life.

April 1 is here, and so is the Membership Tournament Challenge! Between April 1 & June 30, all jurisdictions in the United States and Canada will go head-to-head in six, two-week rounds. Each round, the jurisdiction who earns the highest percentage of their membership intake quota will advance to the next round.

Top prize is \$11,000 with a total of \$39,000 up for grabs throughout the 12 weeks.

Here's how it works: The Membership Tournament Challenge will allow all US and Canadian jurisdictions to compete in a membership competition lasting from April 1 through June 30. Each jurisdiction has been assigned a seed in one of four brackets: Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism. Seeding is based on Circle of Honor positioning as of April 1.

This is a single elimination tournament, with jurisdictions facing off in half-month challenges. The jurisdiction that posts the highest intake gain (as percentage of their quota) during that period, will win the match up and move on to the next round. Quotas will be locked in according to that day's Circle of Honor report.

INSURANCE MATTERS

Social Security is not an "Entitlement",...

it's an annuity. That's right the social security benefits that so many retired Americans enjoy and rely on are annuities. An annuity purchased by the tax payer, from the Government.

Every paycheck from the first check you received for working, the Federal Government took out a percentage, (now 7%), to set aside for when you retire, (and your employer matched that contribution). The point I'm making here is that every working American already owns an annuity, and every working American is adding to that annuity with every paycheck.

That annuity is a promise, (from an entity, like the government or an insurance company), to pay you a stream of income, later in life, that you contribute to and they oversee the investment of your hard earned dollars. It's more than a promise it's a legally binding contract; that cannot be changed without your consent. (When dealing with an insurance company, you and the company must agree to all changes. When dealing with the government, the elected representatives, can be voted out of office.)

Annuities have two phases, asset accumulation, (when you add to the annuity and when the entity adds interest earned) and asset distribution, which is when you take your stream of income. The Knights of Columbus can help you grow your money in an annuity contract that you start with us. OR.....you can transfer money to us, just for the distribution phase, insure that your income will not outlive you and your spouse.

For most of us, retirement is going to be about how much income we have, or can generate from our nest eggs, to be comfortable and able to enjoy retirement. An income annuity from the Knights of Columbus can give you piece of mind and a higher payout than the Required Minimum Distributions of your IRA. You should consider allowing the Order to help you manage the payout that can result from your IRA, 401K or other monies you have set aside for your retirement.

It's one more way that, we fulfill Fr. McGivney's dream that no Catholic family suffer financial devastation, (guaranteed income for life). Protecting Catholic Families Since 1882, that's who we are and what we do.

Continuing Toward Going Totally Paperless

We've pointed out the obvious: That paper *does* grow on trees, it is a declining resource. Over the past 8 years the State Council has been moving toward a paperless means of communication.

It began with replacing the 500-copy - 350+ page - Grand Knight & District Deputy Handbooks with CDs – and, as of last year, we now distribute easy-to-use (recyclable) Flash Drives. Both manuals are available (and continuously updated) on-line at www.njkofc.org

In 2011, we also eliminated the 500-copy, 40+ page "monthly packets", and we now distribute the monthly e-newsletter, *The Crusader*, to over 25% of our membership by means of a broadcast blast. Officers, Directors, Chairmen & members alike receive updates in a timely manner. Archives are also available on-line.

Last year we also instituted an e-Call to Convention; an e-Invitation; and an e-Registration for Delegates & Alternates. Also, Reception tickets & Council Convention fees were also available online.

Those who availed themselves of this feature found it to be flawless. Executive Secretary, FDD John Connell, was pleased with the smoothness & accuracy of the registration process.

Also, last year we went paper-less with the 84-page Convention Reports and the 44-page Resolutions. Attendees used their Smart Phones, Tablets or iPads to "shoot" a QR Code image, and were then were able to follow along during the meeting. FDD John Hencinsky was available throughout to help Brothers (myself included!) to download & use the free software.

There were positive comments & suggestions; we WILL work to make the process flawless in the future.
