Progressive Christianity

It is HARD to be a biblical Christian when today's society wants to focus on social issues and a version of morality instead of the truth of the Gospel.

If you know me or my wife personally, you probably realize we are not a shy family at sharing our opinions about any topic. A few years ago, my wife got into a "discussion" if you will, with the son of a friend. The topic...the bible and homosexuality. Now, I won't bore you with all the details of the conversation but instead try and get to the climax and conclusion. Whether you agree or not, throughout the Old and New Testament, this sin is mentioned and condemned. Towards the end of the discussion, the son said to my wife that the Bible is outdated and should be rewritten to support the modern times. My wife responded to him by saying the Bible is the Word of God and can't be rewritten just because society doesn't agree with its teachings. Immediately after that, our friend told her son to stop because, "You won't win a religious discussion with Elizabeth." With all that has been happening in our society, I think back to that comment and think maybe our friend shouldn't have stopped the conversation. Maybe continuing the discussion would have been the better thing to do.

Today's society wants Christians to be progressive. And the frustrating thing is that many Christians are going along with it. What does Progressive Christianity look like? Diminishing the Bible. I read an article about this that said, "Churches that change due to shifting cultural norms risk losing the truth."

I think that's an important statement. As Christians, we believe the Bible is the Word of God and is true. The Bible is God's word through inspired human authors to tell of God's creation, how sin entered the world, and the redemption that is found through Jesus Christ and his salvation. I've heard people say things like the author of the chapter, such as Paul or John, wrote it; that it is their message, not God's.

Feelings over facts. If people don't like a verse or subject in the bible because it doesn't make them feel all "warm and fuzzy inside," they don't feel like it could be true. Some great examples are love and hell. Biblical love is putting the needs of others first where the progressive movement defines love as acceptance or even indulgence of whatever a person wants. By this definition, progressives can't accept or grasp the concept of hell and can't believe God would send anyone there.

Redefining historic terms. Progressives believe in the ideology of science and the recent sentiments and look to reinterpret scripture to support it. They may use biblical language but shift its meaning. An example would be the resurrection becomes a metaphor instead of a historical fact. The Gospel message shifts from sin and redemption to social justice. The scriptures talk about justice frequently and this should be important to Christians. However, the popular "social justice" is really a political ideology that is not connected to biblical justice. In reading some articles around this topic, I found one that summed it up nicely for me. "The Gospel is not about God making paradise of this world, but God raising us to a new heaven and earth. When social justice replaces the Gospel, you won't get the Gospel, but you also won't get justice."

Progressive Christianity is popular because people don't want to offend anyone or be accused of "pushing" their beliefs on anyone. The pressure to compromise so we fit into the current culture is significant. However, we can't let fear redirect the way we read scripture. Confidence is key. Conviction and courage. Do not be afraid to stand up for the Word of God. Every time the Christian faith gets bullied, it gets stronger. Through all the struggles we experience, we need to remember our true authority, Jesus Christ.

We've had a long time to think about how our Fish Fry Families would respond in 2021.

We have our answer; the Fish Fry Families turned out in large numbers. Plans were made to serve 300 dinners; each and every one was sold; more could have been sold; these folks will be back next week and the Knights will catch more fish. You can expect many changes compared to previous years due to COVID-19 concerns to ensure the safety of everyone volunteering and interacting with the public.

Among changes are:

- There will be NO indoor dining; drive thru ONLY
- No food choices will be a pre-packaged meal (details to come)
- We will need volunteers to sign up for a specific job in advance and stay there. (Ex: if you are at the deep frier, you will remain there all shift. Should you need something, the runners will get it for you)
- Masks will be required
- Temperatures will be taken at start of shift
- Contact tracing guidelines will be followed

How to Sign Up

Instructions (Read the 5 points below before doing #1)

3. Note the date tabs at the bottom of the spreadsheet and select the date for which you are volunteering. When volunteering for multiple weeks, you will need to go to each tab and make your selections.

4. Find the job you wish to fill and enter your name in Column F. Move on to the next date tab and enter your name.

5. The spreadsheet saves entries automatically. So, when complete, exit from the document. You're done.

Your Officers and Committee Chairs 2020- 2021 Fraternal Year Officers

Each year your council elects and appoints new men to take on leadership roles within your council. Sometimes these roles are well-defined while other times the role may be expanded based on that individuals talents or interests. The following text offers an approach that may be helpful for new councils in appointing their first set of officers or for existing councils looking to expand the responsibilities of their existing officers. These suggestions may not work on every campus, however, we hope this approach will benefit at least a few officer roles.

Elected Positions



Grand Knight – The grand knight is the chief executive officer of the council. He is responsible for setting council goals and ensuring that all officers fulfill their duties in reaching these objectives. He presides over all meetings; appoints program and committee directors as needed and fills officer roles in the event of vacancies; countersigns checks and orders for payment; and is responsible for the council's First Degree Team. Ideally, the grand knight should be a junior so that as a senior he can serve as a mentor for the next grand knight. - **SK Christopher Bell,** 678 447-5189 <u>christopher.bell@hilti.com</u>



Deputy Grand Knight – The deputy grand knight serves as the grand knight's right hand man and should fill in for the grand knight when he is not present. Additionally, the deputy grand knight will likely lead a committee, or multiple, if he chooses to do so. Some deputy grand knights serve as their council's program director. Ultimately, he assists the grand knight in leading the council and reaching council objectives. In some councils, the deputy grand knight role might be used to groom a possible grand knight candidate for the following year. Finally, the deputy grand knight may serve as a liaison between the council and other groups that share similar interest (i.e. Newman Club, pro-life club, etc.).-

Chancellor – The chancellor assists both the grand and deputy grand knights in the leading of the council by engaging and strengthening the council's members. His primary responsibilities include both recruiting and retaining members and to this end he should set up different events that display the different values and principles of the Knights of Columbus. The chancellor should participate in the council's degree team and should serve on both the Admission and Retention Committees.-

Treasurer – The treasurer is responsible for managing the council funds, whether in bank or school accounts. He receives money from the financial secretary and deposits funds into council accounts. He is also responsible for paying all council expenses. Finally, he balances and verifies the ledger and keeps the updated budget once approved by the council. -

Advocate – The council advocate acts as council parliamentarian; he should be knowledgeable in Robert's Rules of Order and *Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting* (#1937). He may seek legal assistance from the state advocate, should issues arise. The advocate should be able to take on additional responsibilities as the council deems necessary. -

Warden – The warden is responsible for the property owned by the council. He is also in charge of setting up meetings and leads both the inside and outside guards. Many college councils utilize the warden and guards as custodians of the campus ministry property which may include raking leaves, shoveling snow and assisting with maintenance of the interior. -

Appointed Positions

Chaplain – The chaplain is the spiritual leader of the council who works to bring out the true values of the Knights of Columbus. He nurtures the faith in council members particularly through the sacraments but also through spiritual direction, retreats and other events and support. The grand knight should meet regularly with the council chaplain to see how the council can best support the Catholic community on campus. -

Financial Secretary – The financial secretary is chosen by the trustees and the officers of the council for a three year term and approved by the supreme knight. He holds an important position of continuity within the council and has the responsibility of collecting dues as well as ensuring that the council's financial recordings are kept up to date. Additionally, he ensures that membership records are current, issues membership cards, files regular reports to the district, regional, state and supreme offices and submits the annual 990 to the IRS. Because of his important role, the financial secretary cannot be an undergraduate student, but ideally should be a member of the campus faculty or staff. If no one from the campus community can serve in this role, it should be an adult member of the neighboring community. - **Gregory P Santini**



Lecturer - The lecturer provides brief spiritual discourses and reflections during business meetings for the "Good of the Order". If the lecturer cannot be present, he should appoint a council member to give the reflection for him.. - **SK Joseph M Simone**

Program Director – The program director is appointed by the grand knight and oversees the six surge with service committees (church, community, council, family, youth and culture of life). In some councils this may be the duty of the deputy grand knight. The program director should ensure that all his subordinate committees meet regularly and plan appropriate events. He communicates individual committee reports to the grand knight.

Membership Director – The membership director serves as the head of the Admission Committee and works to grow the council's membership through new and transfer members. He should actively identify potential recruits, plan recruitment programs, host informational meetings and encourage council members to seek candidates. In addition, the membership director should ensure that a council has access to frequent degrees (whether its own or local councils) and should work that each member reaches at least the third degree in a timely manner.

Retention Chairman – The retention chairman works to keep the councils members active once they join. He should consider implementing programs and practices that provide mentors for new members and he should regularly communicate with the council to encourage their participation. When students graduate, the retention chairman should help them transfer to a council in their area. At times when a council wishes to suspend members, they must have the retention chairman make an effort to keep these members or have them transfer to another council.

Other Council Positions

These are positions that are not required by or reported to the Supreme Council, however, many college councils have had found success by utilizing these roles. In many cases, these roles may be filled by council officers who have these unique responsibilities in addition to their other duties.

Campus Ministry Liaison – In order to best communicate and collaborate with other Catholic groups and ministries on campus, the council should have a liaison to campus ministry staff, student advisory board and specific groups (such as the Pro-Life Club). The deputy grand knight can be a good fit for this role.

Social Media Chairman – The social media chairman is responsible for overseeing the council's social media accounts and making sure new content is posted on a regular basis. At minimum, at least two council members should have access to these accounts, ideally at least the recorder and grand knight.

Alumni Relations Chairman – Maintaining healthy relationships with alumni members can help the council utilize these relationships for mentorship and financial assistance. The alumni relations chairman should communicate regularly with alumni and plan at least one or two alumni/council events per year, usually in conjunction with homecoming or other campus alumni events.
