With Easter falling on April 1, we have one full month of Lent ahead of us in March. Lent reminds us that Jesus went into the desert for forty days. The Spirit drove him there. Time alone with the Heavenly Father was important for him. Mark and the other Evangelists remind us that Jesus often went away to be alone with the Father in prayer. In Mark 4:10, we also read, "When Jesus was alone, those present, along with the Twelve, questioned him about the parables." Luke and Matthew only mention the Twelve in their relating the same scene. Mark's mentioning of others - "those present" - can encourage us to seek time alone with Jesus as well. Such time can give us a better understanding of Jesus, especially when we have taken time to read Scripture as well. A better understanding of Jesus will lead us to a deeper relationship with Christ - deepening our faith.

Lent is also a time of almsgiving. While the Knights are always generous, this Lent could be a good time to do some additional almsgiving in some small way. During the last week of the month, we will have the Good Friday collection for Christians in Israel and Palestine. Catholic Near-East Welfare Association. Almsgiving is another way to deepen our faith in Christ. We give of ourselves trusting that God will take care of us. May God bless you.

#### Seminarians Corner Deacon Nick Adam



Brother Knights,

As I near the midway point of my final semester in the seminary, I am filled with gratitude for all the support that Council 802 has given to me not just during my formation, but prior to it as a parishioner and as a member of the Council. I have said it before, but you men played a big role in my discernment, and so I thank you for your faithful example.

This semester we are delving into very practical realities that the Church is facing today. One excellent class is on the vocation of the laity. In our country the term "laymen" can have misleading connotations. We ask people to put difficult terminology into "laymen's" terms, leading us to think that to be a lay person must be something less than an expert. This is incorrect! Laymen and women in the Church are called to be experts at living the Christian life in the world. They are called to consecrate the world back to God. The Catholic

professional can, and should, take what he receives on Sunday and let that grace work through him on Monday. He should receive forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and forgive others that wrong him in daily life. He should share the good news by word and example.

I think that many do not see the role of the laity this way, and perhaps think that only the activities we do within the walls of the Church "count" toward living a holy life. This is not the case. Of course, the Knights of Columbus are a great example of the great work that can be done with the help of the sacraments and strong faith in Christ. I encourage each of you to continue living out your faith in the world, even in the smallest ways, this is how we can truly sanctify the world and bring more and more people into God's fold.
