



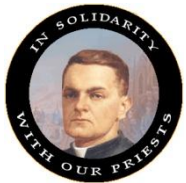

14 January 2013

Dear Knights,

Father Henry at St. Jerome and Father Dan at Holy Trinity have both been giving me opportunities to preach and that has been wonderful. It causes me to confront some fears, but it is also very amazing how the Lord works in those moments and times. He is very, very faithful, even if we falter.

Remember, the Lord chooses ordinary men, men who the world does not esteem, and makes them the most esteemed in His eyes and in the eyes of all the angels and saints. He does this to show His glory, glory which He does not share with any other. And this is right, for He is our Savior, He made us, and we belong to Him.

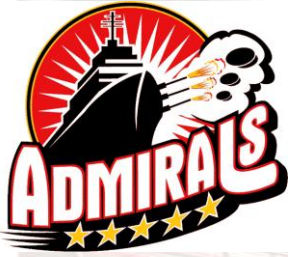
