CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

"They May Be All One"

Quoting John the Evangelist: "So that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you...so that they may be one, as we are one" (Jn 17:21). Our Pope Francis together with H.H. Kirill, patriarch of Moscow and all Russia, for the first time joined a common declaration.

"Pained by the loss of unity, the outcome of human weakness and of sin" the Pope, Kirill and all Russia desire unity in Christ and in the Tradition shared in the first 10 centuries. Wishing to join again the richness of our faith together Catholics and Orthodox in the communion in the Eucharist and the expression of our faith in God, one in three Persons – Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The declaration is highly important because it's a witness in front of a changing word toward violent ideologies:

• Our gaze must firstly turn to those regions of the world where Christians are victims of persecution. In many countries of the Middle East and North Africa whole families, villages and cities of our brothers and sisters in Christ are being completely exterminated. It is with pain that we call to mind the situation in Syria, Iraq and other countries of the Middle East, and the massive exodus of Christians from the land in which our faith was first disseminated and in which they have lived since the time of the Apostles, together with other religious communities.

• The unprecedented renewal of the Christian faith in Russia, as well as in many other countries of Eastern Europe, formerly dominated for decades by atheist regimes.

• The family is based on marriage, an act of freely given and faithful love between a man and a woman. It is love that seals their union and teaches them to accept one another as a gift. Marriage is a school of love and faithfulness. We (Continued on page 5)

regret that other forms of cohabitation have been placed on the same level as this union, while the concept, consecrated in the biblical tradition, of paternity and maternity as the distinct vocation of man and woman in marriage is being banished from the public conscience.

• We call on all to respect the inalienable right to life. Millions are denied the very right to be born into the world. The blood of the unborn cries out to God (cf. Gen 4:10).

• The emergence of so-called euthanasia leads elderly people and the disabled begin to feel that they are a burden on their families and on society in general and the manipulation of human life.

They urged to the young people the task to "<u>not hiding your talent in the</u> <u>ground</u> (cf. Mt 25:25), but of using all the abilities God has given you to confirm Christ's truth in the world, incarnating in your own lives the evangelical commandments of the love of God and of one's neighbor. Do not be afraid of going against the current, defending God's truth, to which contemporary secular norms are often far from conforming."

May our witness by the mission to preach the Gospel in the world be a constant reminder that "you have been purchased at a great price" (1 Cor 6:20), at a cost of the death on the cross of the Man - God Jesus Christ.

The Warden's Take

MATTHEW:6 for Lent

We are now in the middle of Lent. I remember when I was a child growing up in the 1950's and 60's (I'm baby boomer), we were taught that you should give up something for Lent. That is what Christ did when he went into the desert. He allowed Himself to be tempted so when we give something up we must experience the temptation of giving in to denial.

As I got older there were those who suggested that you do something extra as a form of sacrifice. That is when you do something extra you are giving up your time or an enjoyable activity.

This is a very different form of denial. In 2014, I was listening to Gus Lloyd on the Catholic Channel (SIRIUS/XM radio) one morning just before the Lenten season and he said that for Lent he was going to read Chapter 6 of the Gospel according to St. Matthew every day for the entire Lenten Season.

So for the last two Lenten Seasons I have done just that. So what is the big deal, you say? As in all books of the Bible they have their own teachable lessons. Matthew first starts telling us what Christ said in teaching about almsgiving. Next, he teaches us about prayer and he follows this with the Lord's Prayer.

How to fast is explained. St. Matthew tells us how Jesus explains about treasure in Heaven (not the \$1.3 billion just won here on earth). One could do a ton of charity work with that, don't you think?

Finishing up, St. Matthew tells about the light of the body, God and money, and the dependence on God.

I hope that you are having a meaningful Lent. Join me in reading it every day for the remainder of lent.

Money Motions

The following money motions were presented by PGK Russell Sutton at the February 2016 Business Meeting:

Money Motion 1: Money motion to transfer money from the council general fund in the amount of \$2,500 to the Building Association to correct a bookkeeping error. Motion to be published in the March 2016 *Knight Life* and voted on at the April 2016 Business Meeting.

Money Motion 2: Money motion to transfer money from the Council General Fund in the amount of \$13,400 to the building company for council building improvements. Building Association shall present improvement plan proposals to the trustees for approval prior to awarding contracts. Money shall be spent in the 2015/2016 Fraternal Year. Motion to be published in the March 2016 *Knight Life* and voted on at the April 2016 Business Meeting.

Money Motion 3: Due to a number of church and convent burglaries in recent years, the St John the Evangelist Parish took on the task, on recommendation, of removing all bushes around parish building structures to reduce the chances of future burglaries. The parish received estimates of \$40,000 and \$50,000. In order to reduce cost, Father Calis is utilizing the parish tax exempt status to procure many of the new shrubs that are currently in place around buildings. Much work remains and will resume in the spring with the planting of trees.

Therefore this money motion is to approve and expend funds in the amount of \$3,000.00 to Fr. Calis of St. John the Evangelist Parish, Silver Spring, MD, for the landscaping project that is under way on the convent, church and rectory grounds to be completed in mid-2016.
