#### Chaplain's Reflection Cheerful Giver

Jesus tells us in the Gospels, "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all." However, despite our best intentions, many of us struggle to be "cheerful givers" (2 Cor 9:7). This can happen to anyone who gives of themself in service to others. But, it can be especially challenging to minister to members of our own families who may require more time, resources and patience than we can give.

St. Francis of Assisi reminds us that it is "in giving that we receive." However, we cannot give what we do not have. An unwillingness to say "no" when we must eventually wears us down to the point that ministry becomes a burden and not a joy. So, we must learn to be like Jesus, set limits and recognize that we cannot "fix" everything.

Usually, people who minister to others are kind-hearted and prone to taking on other people's problems. But, if they don't have clear personal boundaries and limits they will quickly be overwhelmed. They will have trouble saying "no" and will avoid speaking the truth in love. They will become more readily drawn into trying to "rescue" others by "fixing" their problems. Without intending to, they may end up enabling selfish or irresponsible behavior in others that impedes their personal growth.

We do not have to say "yes" every time to what people feel that they need from us. We should not feel guilty about setting boundaries and saying "no." Like Jesus, we cannot fix everything. And, whether due to circumstances beyond the control of those we minister or the result of poor life choices on his or her part, some things cannot be fixed.

Jesus did say, "There is more happiness in giving than receiving" (Acts 20:35). However, that happiness only abounds to a cheerful giver. If we are giving out a sense of obligation, we will not experience the same grace of God that comes to a cheerful giver (2 Cor 9:7-9). Jesus, in his humanity, recognized his limitations such as being in a

human body that needed nourishment and rest, and that He could only be in one place at a time. Jesus did not attempt to be available 24 hours a day 7 days a week. Jesus had personal needs that He a put priority on, such as retreating to pray. Sometimes Jesus put this need to pray even over the needs of other people and He did so without feeling guilty. That way, Jesus could be refreshed, ready, and able to be compassionate and generous in his response to people.

There were many people in the towns and villages that Jesus preached in that He did not help. If Jesus had cured everyone who was blind, deaf, lame or suffered from some other malady, he never would have been crucified. But, when Jesus did help other people he always expected them to do their part and grow. The man born blind had to walk a long way to get to the pool of Siloam to wash the mud from his eyes.

Recognizing that Jesus lived with the limitations of His human nature should help us appreciate that sometimes, even though we wish we could do more, we also have to sometimes say "no" to people, speak the truth and live within our personal limitations.

There really was a St. Patrick but he was not Irish. According to the Farmer's Almanac for 2019, he was born in Britain as Maewyn Succcat. At age 16 (around AD 400) he was kidnapped from his home on the west coast and carried off to Ireland to become a slave who worked as a shepherd. After six years he escaped; upon returning home, he received his call (in a dream) to preach the Gospel. He spent the next 15 or so years in a monastery preparing for his missionary work. When he became a priest, his name was changed to Patricius and, eventually, Patrick. Although some Christians lived in Ireland at the time, it was Patrick who spread Christianity throughout the land and brought an organized church into existence.

Initially, Saint Patrick's color was blue, not green, say historians. The use of green for St Patrick's Day began during the 1798 Rebellion when the clover became a symbol of nationalism and the "wearing of the green" on lapels became regular practice. The green soon spread to uniforms as well.
