Chaplain's Reflection Trying to be Like God

The creation story in the Book of Genesis tells how the devil successfully tempted Adam and Eve to try to be "like" God. The three temptations of Christ as presented in the Gospel of Matthew shows Jesus rebuffing this same devil who wanted him to use His divinity and be "like" humanity and use His personal power on earth.

In the Genesis story, God tells Adam and Eve that they can eat of all of the trees in the garden except for one, the tree of knowledge of good and evil. A big permission, considering that God surely knew that they would fail. But, in giving that permission God shows us the degree of freedom he allows us even though we make all kinds of mistakes.

The problem was that if Adam and Eve ate of this tree they would be "like" God and all of us have "inherited" this trait. But we are creatures, being "like" God can never be the same thing as actually "being" God. We can never be God. Only God knows what's really good and what's really evil. Whenever we try to be "like" God, we come to manifest the prideful and arrogant attitude that comes from "thinking" that we know.

But, it is this "knowing" that characterizes evil. Evil is always absolutely certain. Evil suffers no self doubt. It allows no criticism. I am right and I know. This is the mantra of enlightened despots. But, it is also the mantra of anyone who tries to control others in all kinds of other settings, including families.

Jesus also observed this in the local religious leaders who were in it for themselves. However, for we who are trying to live what we hope is a good life, we have to live in the hinterlands called faith where we can never be absolutely sure we're right. Any thinking that we may have an absolute knowledge of good and evil is a sure path to discord and even death.

All three of the temptations of Christ have their root in the misuse of power. The need for power in all of its multitudinous forms is deep in all of us. And that demon does not die easily. It keeps coming back and tempting us in new forms. It's scary how subtly these temptations can invade our personas. We might not even recognize our actions as efforts to control.

- A very successful grab and go Family Breakfast with Santa that was quickly arranged when our parishes cancelled their programs
- Our equipment loan closet, in which we provided a wheelchair and walkers to families in need within the Rosensteel
- Donation of infant socks and \$200 to Gabriel Project of Montgomery County
- A Novena for Life
- A \$200 donation to Maryland Special Olympics that included a January 2021 plunge into the Chesapeake Bay by our Brother Knight Geoff Conway (what was he thinking?)
- Delivering to different families a refrigerator and a chair that can lift a person to a standing position, delivering a full-size sofa to A Wider Circle and removing a sleep sofa and other items from a 4th floor apartment that didn't have an elevator
- Providing scholarships of \$500 each to four seminarians
- Donating \$100 to buy and inscribe with the Council name and number a chalice for the Missionaries of Charity, to be used at home and traveling Masses
- Serving as the drop-off and distribution center for the Tootsie Roll program serving Councils throughout Montgomery County.

The third one can rightly be seen as a temptation to political power, all the kingdoms of the world. And we see how much our world wants that power. They'll do anything, they'll tell any lie to get political power. When Satan sees that he cannot seduce Jesus by a misuse of power he simply gives up.

The first step in any spiritual journey is to face the reality that you are not as powerful as you think you are. There are some things that you cannot do, there are some things that you cannot change. The world is what it is and reality is always broken. Thus, there is a tragic sense to life. And what Lent is about is somehow asking for and, hopefully, receiving the grace to accept the essentially tragic nature of human existence.

Our existence is contingent. We are born and we will die. Everything in between is like a journey through the school of life. Growing up, waking up, showing up, cleaning up, becoming the full image that we were created in, which is always and forever the image of God.


