Dear Brother Knights,

I hope all my Brother Knights and your families are doing well! Now that the Lenten season is with us, I'm looking forward to attending weekly Stations of the Cross, Rosaries and Chaplets of Divine Mercy.

I have four items to update on:

Our Fraternal Year 2020-2021 Anchor Award Nominations were due by end of February. Those nominations are now closed. I will be sharing the nominations with our State Deputy and the State Officers. It is very exciting to see all the outstanding award nominations. It will once again be a very difficult decision to determine our recipient for this fraternal year. One item that I've been discussing with our State Deputy is that ALL nominees should be very proud. In previous years, we tend to keep the nominations private and may do so again... but the analogy I like to make is with the Academy Awards... You can be an Academy award winner and an Academy award nominee... both carry a level of honor and prestige. Our State Officers will discuss at the next meeting if we can/should provide some level of recognition to those who were nominated for the Anchor Award but not selected as the recipient.

Our VIRTUAL convention will be on May 1<sup>st</sup>. Additional details to follow once the State council and Supreme complete the logistics. I have received the council credentials from 6 councils so far (297, 917, 3664, 2285, 5041 and 9146). Please assure (Grand Knights) each council completes their credential form (sent separately) with information about your two council delegates and two council alternates. Only the delegates will be permitted to VOTE. If you misplaced the MS work (PDF, ODT) file I've sent, I'm happy to resend... just let me know.

We are making excellent progress on our State's 2<sup>nd</sup> Half Per Capita Invoice remittance. This is for 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the 2020-2021 Fraternal Year. Thus far, I have received remittance from 31 councils with 6 active councils remaining (2610, 6816, 7763, 7810, 13574 and 14351.

Lastly, our State Council has paid the Liability Insurance for this fraternal year. To those councils (17 total) who have requested to participate in the liability insurance, I will be sending your invoice to the GK and FS using the standard quick books invoice email

# IMPORTANT NOTICE TO APPLICANT

To qualify you must be a son or daughter of a Knight of Columbus member (paternal or legally adopted) in good standing in a subordinate Council within the Vermont jurisdiction. Sons or daughters of deceased members are also eligible if their father was in good standing at the time of his death. An applicant may be a member of the Knights of Columbus or a member of a Columbian Squires Circle, in the jurisdiction of Vermont and a high school senior qualifying to graduate in June 2021.

This scholarship is given by the Vermont Knights of Columbus to assist in your education at an accredited school or college of your choice.

Applications must be returned to the Chairman, at the address above, by March 10, 2021 to qualify for an award.

The application is in two parts with the major portion of Part II being completed by your school personnel. Therefore, we strongly suggest Part II be given to them <u>immediately</u> to allow the maximum time to prepare their part of the application.

The filing date should be brought to the attention of the guidance personnel of your school, since **delinquent applications may disqualify an applicant from consideration for an award.** 

Failure to submit your essay may also result in the application being invalidated.

Scholarships not claimed by February 1, 2022 will be forfeited and the prize will be given to the next alternate on the list.

# **VOCATIONS**

Through the Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP) the Knights of Columbus has cultivated this spiritual soil for more than 40 years. While the order has a number of vocations programs, RSVP is the primary program through which councils, assemblies and circles provide financial and moral support to men and women preparing for the priesthood or religious life, and every council, assembly and circle is encouraged to participate.

RSVP allows councils and assemblies to "adopt" one or more seminarians or postulants and provide them with financial assistance and moral support.

The intent of RSVP is to demonstrate support for individual seminarians. RSVP support is not solely financial aid, and councils are asked not to base their support on the financial needs of the seminarian. All seminarians are worthy of support through RSVP by virtue of the fact that they are discerning a religious vocation, not because of their financial situation.

Please remember that with RSVP, Knights provide more than financial support; members write letters to the seminarians or postulants, sponsor dinners for them, invite them to join the council and, most importantly, pray for vocations.

Please support our seminarians through our RSVP program which is both moral and financial support. Under this program, councils and assemblies make an annual minimum donation of \$500 or more to an individual seminarian or postulant to help with expenses. The sum must go to a single qualified person; it may not be divided or apportioned to more than one recipient. Councils and assemblies can sponsor more then one seminarian or postulant if their resources permit. For every \$500 donated, the council or assembly is eligible for a refund of \$100.

Our (RSVP) Scholarship money is used by seminarians and those in religious formation for books, car insurance and maintenance, travel during vacations, clerical clothing, emergency expenditures and other living expenses.

I ask that all our councils work with me as your State Vocations Chairman to ensure the proper and complete implementation of the RSVP program to ensure that every seminarian sponsored by the diocese is included in the RSVP program.

Re: Resolutions to be Presented at State Convention
To: State Officers and Directors, District Deputies and Grand Knights

The Laws of the Knights of Columbus permit subordinate councils to submit to the State Council resolutions that pertain to issues affecting the entire Order. It is expected that all such resolutions will be submitted in good faith and in a spirit of charity, unity, and fraternity. As you prepare for the State convention, please bear in mind the principles and procedures set forth below.

The State Council resolutions process was established to enable subordinate councils to:

- Express gratitude or support for a person, a fraternal program, or a policy of the Order;
- 2. Amend the State By-Laws, Policies or Resolutions;
- Express an official position of the Knights of Columbus on matters relevant to the mission and identity of the Order; and
- 4. Offer proposals to enhance the Order's fraternal mission.

Subordinate Councils should not submit resolutions that: (1) concern monetary expenditures by the State Council, such as financial grants to organizations; (2) deal exclusively with matters of local significance that are relevant only to a subordinate council; (3) endorse, recognize, commend, or criticize other organizations; or (4) have been repeatedly rejected by delegates to the State convention in recent years.

Resolutions adopted by a Local Council for consideration by the State Council must be submitted to the VT State Advocate no later than March 15. Please submit these resolutions by email using the following email address: <u>WNMG@AOL.COM</u>

### What you NEED TO KNOW about Proposal 5:

Proposal 5 is a legislative proposal to amend the Vermont Constitution with pro-abortion language.

Proponents of Proposal 5 have stated publicly that their goal is to ensure unlimited, unregulated abortion throughout all nine months of pregnancy.

The final language is below. It has already progressed through the first phase of the amendment process by being approved by both the Vermont House and Senate in 2019.

If the language is approved again in the 2021-2022 legislative session, Article 22 will appear on your general election ballot for a "Yes" or "No" vote in November of 2022.

#### Proposal 5 = Abortion-on-demand

"People on both sides of the debate over abortion know that 'reproductive autonomy' is publicly understood to be a way of referring to an unlimited abortion license, that is, elective abortion permitted through the entire nine months of gestation and pregnancy up to and including the process of birth."

## Proposal 5: (Article 22)

Sec 2. Article 22 of Chapter I of the Vermont Constitution is added to read:

Article 22. [Personal reproductive liberty.]

That an individual's right to personal reproductive autonomy is central to the liberty and dignity to determine one's own life course and shall not be denied or infringed unless justified by a compelling State interest achieved by the least restrictive means.

# What will Proposal 5 mean for Vermont taxpayers?

The guarantee of "personal reproductive autonomy" is likely to be interpreted by lawmakers and the Vermont court system to mean that taxpayers must:

- · Pay for abortions.
- Pay for sterilizations and sterilization reversals.
- Pay for the expenses associated with infertility and surrogacy.
- Fund pro-abortion organizations, like Planned Parenthood.

# What else does "personal reproductive autonomy" mean?

According to supporters of Proposal 5 the right to "personal reproductive autonomy" will mean more than unlimited abortion.

 Proposal 5 will mean whatever the Vermont courts decide it means.  According to Planned Parenthood of Vermont's spokesperson, Proposal 5 "will open up a range of different questions for future lawmakers.....for years to come." ## **Action Alert:**

Call your legislators in the Vermont House and Senate and tell them to vote NO on Proposal 5. You can use the following talking points:

- Amending the Vermont Constitution to include the language of Proposal 5 is reckless and irresponsible, dangerous and expensive as well as morally and ethically wrong.
- The lives of countless unborn babies will be placed at further risk of abortion if Proposal 5 is adopted.
- Vermonters cannot afford Proposal 5 and all of its unknown repercussions.

#### **Ultrasound Project**

In early 2020, the Knights of Bristol, Vergennes, and Middlebury teamed up to further their mission of supporting life by sponsoring an ultrasound rental at the Pregnancy Resource Center of Addison County in Middlebury. Despite the challenges of the pandemic and limited availability, the Center utilized the machine on multiple occasions, allowing pregnant women to see the life growing in their womb at no cost. Seeing the value of long-term, regular availability, the councils began discussions in late 2020 to purchase

Over the recent weeks, Knights from the three councils have begun raising the funds amongst their ranks. Following that effort, the project is open to the parish and broader communities for additional contributions. Together, this initiative can be a powerful statement of support for life and strong families.
