Even your participation in the Friday blessed season of Evening Stations of the Cross this March is a Lent continues, I furthering of Mother Teresa's vision that all encourage you in Christians would embrace the Cross of Christ as their own. The very founding of her Missionaries of Charity was with a view "to quench[ing] the infinite thirst of Jesus on the cross for love and souls" by "labouring at the salvation sanctification of the poorest of the poor."

> As we will celebrate Holy Week and Easter before our April Newsletter is released, I also want to encourage my Brother Knights to come out for the entire Holy Week celebration, if you possibly can. Its richness needs to be savoured by full participation. I would like again this year to offer some reflections on each of the Great Three Days (the "Triduum"), and why each part of the Triduum is important.

> Of course, Holy Week begins with Passion/Palm Sunday (March 24th/25th), our first glimpse that week into the contradictions which Jesus occasions by his coming among us. Palm branches are blessed and waved in imitation of the great enthusiastic welcome Jesus received when he rode into Jerusalem on the donkey. But very soon those cheers turn to jeers as the crowds cry out for Jesus to be crucified, according to Mark's Passion Narrative.

The Monday of Holy Week is, in our Diocese, the traditional evening for the Mass of Chrism. Bishop Douglas Crosby gathers his priests, deacons, and laypeople around him to honour the gift of the priesthood of Christ, and to bless the Holy Oils which will be used in the celebrations of important sacraments throughout the coming year in our parish communities. All are welcome to that Mass, at the Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King, Monday, March 26th, at 7:00 P.M.

On Holy Thursday (March 29th), the Triduum itself begins. Our parish community gathers together at 7:30 P.M. that evening to call to mind the Lord's Last Supper with His disciples, to honour the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood, and to celebrate Christian love and service, symbolized by the ceremony of the Washing of the Feet. The Blessed Sacrament is specially reposed after the closing procession through the church, and you are encouraged to come and "stay awhile" with him that evening, as the Adoration will continue till midnight.

On Good Friday (March 30th), we do not celebrate Mass, but we do assemble to commemorate the Passion of the Lord, to pray in an especially solemn manner for the world's needs, to venerate the Cross of Christ, on which has hung our salvation, and to receive Holy Communion. Our Good Friday in Holy Rosary Parish comprises: a ceremony more geared to families, at 11:00 A.M.; and the traditional adult ceremony at 3:00 P.M. The Knights will at that Liturgy once again do us the honour of carrying the Cross which will be used for the veneration. Plus we have the Stations of the Cross that evening at 7:00 P.M., and then the final opportunity for your Easter Confession will take place after the Stations.

The stillness of grief on Holy Saturday (March 31st) gives way to the overwhelming joy of Jesus' rising from death to life. At 8:00 P.M., we commence the Easter Vigil, with the lighting of the New Fire and the Easter Candle, carried in solemn procession through the church to its place of honour, and praised in song as symbol of the Risen Christ, Light of the World. The Word of God which is read that night traces the whole history of salvation, all leading to Christ. Water is solemnly blessed, and God's people call to mind their cleansing in baptism by renewing baptismal vows and being sprinkled with the Easter Water. This is also the time for adult converts to be received into the church, and we are pleased to have a couple of them that night, to join our parish community......plus, we are praying for all converts all over the world. Then continues the first Mass of Easter.

The baptismal vows and sprinkling are likewise repeated at each Mass celebrated on Easter Sunday itself (April 1st), as we sing a joyful "Alleluia!!" to the One who has made us his own.

Knights should be particularly proud to celebrate the glory of their Risen Lord, since it is under His banner of the victory of the Cross that we march, as we do all our works of praise and service. May the Lord make of you, more and more, signs of his gracious, living presence in the world.

A most joyful Lent, Holy Week, and Easter, to you and yours!

Burlington declares the week of March 5-9 as Special Olympics week in Burlington

On Tuesday, February 20th, GK Ken attended the Burlington City council meeting to hear Mayor Rick Goldring declare the week of March 5-9 "Special Olympics Week" in Burlington. This is now the 3rd year that the Knights of Columbus have worked with the city to help raise awareness of the Special Olympics movement. The now annual Flag Relay is well underway with the flags moving through all 113 districts and ending somewhere near the end of May. The main goal for this year is to focus attention on the Canadian Championships being held in Antigonish, Nova Scotia on July 31.

There are 3 Burlington athletes that have won a spot at these National games and "Coach Cate". Cate Hawkins has been selected to participate as a coach at the games as well. We are working with the other 3 councils in Burlington to set-up a special Flag Raising ceremony at Burlington City Hall on Wednesday March 7th at 10:30 am. We will meet along with members of the Special Olympics in the Atrium of the city hall. The mayor will read the proclamation and say a few words after which we will have a flag available for signing. We will also parade led by the Pope John Paul Il Colour Guard to the flag pole where the flag will be raised and will remain on the pole for the day. Our brothers at St. Antoine-Daniel Council have offered to have coffee and cakes for everyone in the church behind the city hall after the ceremony. Please come out and enjoy this fun event. The Mayor's proclamation will be available for all to see at our meeting in April.

We had 15 athletes out to take the course that is designed to build their self-confidence and to teach them life skills that they might not have an opportunity to learn otherwise. They are able to learn how to work together to analyze problems such as organizing events. They were shown how to categorize the food they eat into the 4 main groups and how to recognize the foods that are not so good for them. They were given an opportunity to write and present a speech in front of a large group which is great training for everyone but especially for these individuals that generally have more difficulty dealing with other people than most. We heard some heart-touching stories of individuals that experienced difficulties due to their disabilities but were able to work through them with the help of parents, coaches and volunteers like our Knights. A special thank you to Don Prescott and his wife Nancy, Hugh Johns and his wife Cathy, Joe Milton, Jim Hession, Sam Cervoni and Ken Fleming for being there to act as mentors.











Brothers help out at Holy Rosary


