Dear Brother Knights,

The first concern voiced at Bishop Kopacz' listening session at St. Patrick was also the concern most frequently voiced. That concern is one for the young men & women of the parish and our inability to foster their relationship with Jesus Christ through the Church He founded. Out of approximately one hundred participants at the listening session, less than twenty could be considered young adults or youth. Some parents and grandparents expressed the need for more social activities for young people. Others, including a twenty-year-old, vocalized the need for our passing on to the younger generation an understanding of the Catholic Church as unique among Christians.

The Knights of Columbus, with their emphasis on marriage and rearing children in the Church, can continue to play a special role in evangelizing young people. The <u>fathersforgood.org</u> website and Facebook page of the Knights presents good resources for relating Catholic faith in Jesus Christ to everyday family life. Most especially the example that you set by your presence in Church is invaluable.

As we enter into a membership drive for the council, we join our efforts to our prayers for the future of the Catholic Church in Lauderdale, Clarke, and Kemper Counties. As a Mississippi native, I believe that one of the gifts of these parishes is that so many of you are from outside the state or have lived outside the state. You have a better sense of the universal nature of the Roman Catholic Church. I have heard Mississippians brag that, through defending our faith, we know it better than other Catholics. I don't see too many still defending the Church, though; and Mississippi easily loses its connection to the universal Church with its Tradition.

It seems to me that, as a small Catholic minority, we tried too hard to convince other Mississippians that our relationship with Christ was just like theirs. We succeeded in convincing young Catholics that there was little difference between the Catholic Church and others. The young gathered that there was nothing positive about being a member of the Church. If the differences between Christian churches don't matter, I don't think I would go to a Church at all. No other Christians in Meridian share our understanding of the presence of Jesus Christ in the Mass.

Your commitment to Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament bears witness to your belief in the teaching of the Church regarding this unique Real Presence of Christ. I'm preaching to the converted to encourage you in the importance of your endeavors as we renew our efforts to evangelize those who have already been baptized in the Church. May God bless you and bless the Church through you. MPS

# Special from John Maloney, POK



Last month I mentioned about Bingo. Needless to say, Professional Bingo Halls were opened in a short time. Our Bingo lost a good many customers. In fact, all the other Bingo's shut down after a few weeks or months but the K of C Bingo rose to the challenge. We completely changed our format. Purchased paper bingo cards (packs), and went up on our prizes. A letter was sent to the three Professional Bingo's telling them about the many charitable organizations we donate to and asked them to not hold their games on Wednesdays. Only one Professional Bingo still played Wednesday night. Then the State Gaming Commission was implemented. To make a long story short, the Gaming Commission closed all the Professional Bingo's over a couple of years. Our Bingo program has always passed their inspections with flying colors.

Before the Casino in Philadelphia opened our program paid \$300.00 for regular bingo games and had a \$4,000.00 jackpot which guaranteed at least \$1,000.00. Our best night before the Casino was built, we cleared \$7,777.00. That night we had 318 customers. We would average 222 customers a night. Over 50 customers came from Philadelphia. Today we use the same bingo program except the prizes have been reduced. The only time \$4,000.00 jackpot was hit was by a man passing through, who saw the Bingo sign and stopped to play. He was from California. He filled the card in 47 numbers. To my knowledge that was the only time \$4,000.00 was paid. We were hit for \$3,000.00 several times over the years.

Seminarians Corner Nick Adam



Brother Knights,

I thought I would change it up a bit this month and give y'all a taste of what we are learning here in the seminary:

Notre Dame Professor Dr. Brant Pitre (pronounced Pea-tree) recently released a new book called *The Case for Jesus*. This book has helped me understand, and explain, the reasons that we have confidence in the accounts of Jesus' life as described in the Gospels. It may surprise you to hear this, but there are many biblical scholars who have cast doubt on very fundamental elements of Gospel literature, such as *who wrote the books*. Pitre's point is simple. In his book (and in his class) he simply states that it is *reasonable* to assert that the Gospels were written by who it says they were written by!

We live in a culture that *loves* skepticism; we love a good theory that calls into question all that we *thought* we knew before. Pitre's book shows that it makes sense to read the Gospels as historical biographies about Jesus written by eyewitnesses (Matthew and John) or near eye-witnesses (Mark and Luke). I can't go into all his arguments, but the result of taking away the skepticism is incredible. When we have the freedom to believe in the stories told in the Gospels as they appear, they can come alive in our prayer life (they certainly have come alive in mine).

Think about this example. Some scholars question whether the nativity accounts in Matthew and Luke were added later as a sort of myth to explain the divine origin of Jesus. These scholars jump to this conclusion because the nativity is not included in Mark (which is generally considered to be the first Gospel written, although this is not certain). Pitre has another idea, what if the nativity stories are included in Luke and Matthew because Luke and Matthew had a source that Mark didn't, a source that knew exactly how the birth of Jesus came about, a source that knew what the angel Gabriel said at the Annunciation. Maybe they included the nativity story because they had access to *Mary* as a source!

I apologize if these are all common sense answers to these questions, but as a student who has grown up in an academic world that loves to question, getting some straightforward answers about sacred scripture has been wonderfully refreshing and helpful to me. I hope that any of you with high school/college/young adult age children would consider putting them onto this book by Dr. Pitre, and I look forward to seeing you all this Easter!!!!

Thank you to all who are praying the 40 Days for Life daily devotionals. The day 8 Scripture reading and the reflection that followed needed our undivided attention and bears repeating.

Jesus said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he fell into the hands of robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. So, too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, took him to an inn and took care of him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said, 'and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have. Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise." —Luke 10:30-37

Reflection: Here Jesus commands us to show mercy to the victims of the culture of violence and death. But why did the priest and Levite fail to show mercy? Perhaps they feared that the robbers were hiding just around the next corner to attack them. They asked themselves, "If I stop to help this man, what will happen to me?"

The Samaritan, however, reversed the question, and asked, "If I don't stop to help this man, what will happen to him?"

In working to save the unborn, let's not worry about what will happen to us if we act; let's worry about what will happen to the unborn if we don't.

Prayer: <u>Father, we are moved by the lesson of the Good Samaritan, who allowed compassion to influence him more</u> than fear. Give us the same heart. Grant that we may never count the cost of standing up and speaking out for the unborn. <u>We pray through Christ our Lord, Amen</u>.
