The Value of Lenten Repentance

We know that the Catholic Church teaches that, in order to be a practicing Catholic, we should make confession at least once a year, usually during Lent. St. Jude gives us many opportunities to fulfill this requirement. Fr. George hears confessions several nights a week and there are penance services scheduled throughout Lent.

But do we take advantage of these opportunities? For all too many Catholics, the answer is probably no. There are a lot of excuses for why we don't go. *It takes too much time* (you may have plenty of time to contemplate those sins some day) – *I can pray directly to God* (of course you can, but you are not guaranteed the graces you'll receive in the Sacrament) – or the best one – *I haven't really sinned* (really?).

There was a period of time in my life that I was away from the Sacrament of Reconciliation for many years. I used all these excuses and many more to justify to myself why I didn't need to go. But I did need to – and God sent a big event into my life that brought me back to the Sacrament.

But you don't need a big event to occur in your life to return to the sacrament – it is always there for you.

Our Catholic Church is wise in requiring us to receive this Sacrament once a year, and I encourage each of you to avail yourself of the graces present in this Sacrament. The importance of regular repentance can be illustrated as follows.

For a moment, imagine your life as an old sailing vessel crossing the Atlantic. Your sextant and compass are your guides. But currents push your ship this way and that. There are inaccuracies in your readings each day. And storms swell up that push you even further off course. And when you get to the New World, you land not at New York (where you wanted to go), but Florida!

In our everyday life, the Church and our conscience are our guides. But the currents of everyday life (TV, Internet, coworkers) drive us off our path. Our misunderstanding of church teachings and our own shortcomings lead us a bit further astray. And crisis arise, like large storms, that drive us further off the path we want to be on. At the end, will we end up somewhere much further south than where we wanted to be?

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a course correction – a reorienting of our lives back towards New York and away from Florida (no offense, Floridians). And these course corrections are easier to make if we haven't veered too far off the right path!

We all drift off the path (as we all sin). Reconciliation forces us to confront our sinfulness, confess it and receive the healing graces of the Holy Spirit.

What a great gift the Church offers us through this sacrament. I challenge each of you to receive it this Lenten season.
