Chaplain's Corner

Can you be tempted to sin, but not sin? Can you say no to an addiction or particular sin that you are trying to get rid of? Yes. Yes you can. And the Gospel for

the 1st Sunday of Lent (Matthew 4:1-11) has Jesus being tempted in various ways by the devil to give us real encouragement. “For[,]” as the Book of Hebrews points out, “we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin” (Hebrews 4:15). Because, Christ went before us to give us an example on how to say no to various temptations, as well as how to be virtuous and do the right thing when presented a variety of challenges throughout life. All of which is why we need to **read the Gospels**. It really is good for you. And better yet, it can be something you do for Lent. You can read just one chapter of a Gospel every day and then think about what’s going on in it, placing yourself in the scene with Christ, and pray to God about It, asking Him how you can apply it to your life. And your life will change for the good. It’s inevitable. You will become a better dad, a better son, a better husband, and a better brother.

So, what should we do when tempted? Well, going back to God’s Word in the Book of Hebrews, we are to “confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help” (Hebrews 4:16). Because, sure, temptations will come, but when they

come, that’s when we need to turn to God and Our Blessed Mother and they will show us their mercy and love by helping us. All, if we care to ask, and then we can go on to receive the graces that they are trying to give us. Thus, battling the temptation with Jesus and Our Lady – together. Not alone. So, strongly consider reading and then meditating on just one chapter of the Gospels each day during Lent, so as to more efficiently equip yourself with the tools you need to be able to say no to temptations in life. For then you will gain even more examples from Christ Himself on how to crush any temptation that comes your way, and always invoke Jesus, Our Lady, and the saints to help you in temptation. For you can never do it alone. And in doing this, you too will avoid falling into temptation.

March Social Meetings -

See attached Flyer. The March family dinner and KofC social are combined for the month of March. The social portion is to have live entertainment, the MWU Pipe Band or a portion of them and Irish Dancers on tap (no pun intended) during the dinner.

Items for Proposed Council Resolutions:

The Council met in February and discussed all and voted on some of the items below. Updates to the items status are included. consider and prioritize the items below for discussion and approval 12 Feb 2020. See you there.

1. Budget amended to increase approved 50% match with Supreme from \$12,000.0 to \$13,500.00 for the Ultrasound machine. The

Ultrasound Maintenance Agreement cost decreased from \$6,144.00 to \$5,200.00 This cost is borne by District 11 Councils and Council 7538. Total for Ultrasound Machine and 2 yr. maintenace agreement drops from \$19,676.00 to \$18,700.00

2. Still under review is the proposal to pay off HCA Student Lunch Debt for this school year. Additional information being requested by PGK Steve Stoecker.

3. Addition of \$2K line item to FY budget for the VKCCI Cornhole Tournament expenses passed. Expenses come out of registrations.

Items 4, 5, and 6 require estimates from contractors. FCC Pres. Bob Jankovits and Treas. Mark Gardner are going to schedule estimates for the work outlined in 4, 5 and 6 below:

4. Consider proposal to replace FCC ceiling estimated at: \$7,000.00.

5. Consider proposal to replace flooring in kitchen, bathrooms and hallway estimated \$6,000.00.

6. Consider proposal to spackle and paint FCC. Council buys paint, members paint, \$?00.00

7. Consider proposal to have an Interior Decorator, potentially a brother/family member or someone familiar with the KofC to organize/design wall space use for awards, pictures and other items in the hall to obtain the most pleasant atmosphere possible. \$?000.00

The projected estimate for items 1, 4, 5, 6 is \$36,700.00. This is a decrease in cost from the previous total of: \$43,176.00. A difference of \$6,476.00. This does not take into consideration the council paying up to \$4,000.00 for HCA Lunch debt. Which raises the total to \$40,700.00.

Council 4034 will have an Open House for our non-member parishioners at the Parish Life Center on Friday, 15 May 2020 from 7:30-9:00 PM. The purpose of the open house is to share with our fellow parishioners what the Knights of Columbus has to offer besides charitable works to members. Recently, Council 4034 has come under the service area of the Abbate Agency for the Knights of Columbus. The Abbate Agency was the No. 1 agency in the entire order within the past couple years. This evening promises to be much more than a fraternal benefits night. Brothers, to share the work of charity we must grow our council with men who would like to be knights but need more information. Look around our parish and Holy Cross Academy and see if you can encourage a non-knight or couple to attend our open house.
