Monday

May 28, 2018



Soldier; rest thy warfare, o'er Dream of fighting fields no more. Sleep the sleep that knows not breaking, Morn of toil, nor night of waking.

It was **General John A. Logan** of the Grand Army of the Republic who designated May 30, 1868, "as a day for strewing with flowers" or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village, or hamlet churchyard in the land.

"It is the purpose of the commander-in-chief to inaugurate this observance with the hope that it will be kept from year to year while a survivor of the war remains to honor the memory of the departed."

USCCB RELIGIOUS LIBERTY CHAIRMAN ANNOUNCES RELIGIOUS FREEDOM WEEK FROM JUNE 22-29, 2018

Catholics across the United States are encouraged to pray and act in support of religious liberty at home and abroad during Serving Others in God's Love: Religious Freedom Week 2018, which begins on June 22, the Feast of Sts. Thomas More and John Fisher, and ends on June 29, the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul.

The chairman of the USCCB's Committee for Religious Liberty, Archbishop Joseph E. Kurtz of Louisville, states: "Religious freedom allows the space for people of faith to serve others in God's love in ministries like education, adoption and foster care, health care, and migration and refugee services.

We encourage people of faith to reflect on the importance of religious freedom so that we might have the space to carry out our mission of service and mercy, and we invite everyone to pray for our brothers and sisters who face intense persecution in other parts of the world."

Mother's Day

In the United States Mother's Day was first suggested in 1872 by Julia Ward Howe (who wrote the words to the Battle Hymn of the Republic) as a day dedicated to peace. Ms. Howe would hold organized Mother's Day meetings in Boston ever year.

In 1907 Ana Jarvis, from Philadelphia, began a campaign to establish a national Mother's Day. Ms. Jarvis persuaded her mother's church in Grafton, West Virginia to celebrate Mother's Day on the second anniversary of her mother's death, the 2nd Sunday of May. By the next year Mother's Day was also celebrated in Philadelphia.

Ms. Jarvis and her supporters began to write to ministers, businessmen, and politicians in their quest to establish a national Mother's Day. It was successful as by 1911 Mother's Day was celebrated in almost every state.

President Woodrow Wilson, in 1914, made the official announcement proclaiming Mother's Day as a national holiday that was to be held each year on the 2nd Sunday of May.



In the United States, the first modern <u>Father's Day</u> celebration was held on July 5, 1908, in Fairmont, West Virginia.

It was first celebrated as a church service at Williams Memorial Methodist Episcopal Church South, now known as Central United Methodist Church.



COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Election of council officers is quickly approaching. Section 128 of the Laws of the Order indicates that officers are to be elected by ballot at a regular business meeting held between the first day of May, up to and including the fifteenth day of June. Section 128 also states that college councils may elect officers at a regular business meeting held between the first day of March, up to and including the first day of June. Immediately after the election of officers, the financial secretary should report the officers-elect to the Supreme Council using the Member Management Application located in Officers Online on the Knights of Columbus web site or by using the Report of Officers Chosen for the Term (#185).

COLUMBIAN AWARD **APPLICATIONS**

Applications for the Columbia Award (SP-7) are due at the Supreme Council office by June 30. 2018. Every council should submit a Columbian Award application.

Qualifying for this award is necessary for consideration for the Star Council Award.


