MOTHERS DAY STORY - The story of Mothers Day is a long one. It is neither a recent phenomenon as many people believe it to be nor is it the creation of the card and gift marketers syndicate. To the surprise of many, Mothers Day celebrations were first said to have taken place in the time of ancient Greeks and Romans hundreds of years ago. In the United States Mothers Day is just less than one hundred years old. Due to the hard work and struggles of Anna Jarvis (who was never married nor had children) and poet Julia Ward Howe , Mothers Day was



declared a national holiday by President Woodrow Wilson who designated the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day on May 8, 1914. Mrs. Jarvis got the inspiration of celebrating Mothers Day from her own mother Mrs. Anna Marie Reeves Jarvis in her childhood. An activist and social worker, Mrs. Jarvis used to express her desire that someday someone must honor all mothers, living and dead, and pay tribute to the contributions made by them. Today, Mothers Day is celebrated in more than 46 countries around the world though at different times in the month of May. In some countries it is celebrated at entirely different times of the year. Mothers Day has come to be internationally recognized as the day to honor all mothers and thank them for the services and sacrifices they impart for the benefit of their children and consequently to the development of mankind. We as Brother Knights pay honor, respect and celebration to all mothers and our wives not only on May 12th but each and every day of the year.

Captain Emil Kapaun - Korean War Veteran

(died 1951)

Priest and Medal of Honor Recipient

"An American soldier who didn't fire a gun, but who [carried] the mightiest weapon of all: the love for his brothers so powerful that he was willing to die so that they might live."

Kapaun began his military chaplaincy at Camp Wheeler, Georgia, in October 1944. He and one other chaplain ministered to approximately 19,000 service men and women.^[6]

He was sent to India and served in the Burma Theater. [4] Kapaun was promoted to captain in January 1946. [4] and returned stateside in May 1946. Kapaun was discharged in 1946. He earned an M.A. in education at the The Catholic University of America in 1948. In September 1948, he re-joined the Army and resumed his chaplaincy at Fort Bliss, El Paso, Texas. Kapaun left his parents and Pilsen for the last time in December 1949.
