The Blessed Virgin Mary



The month of May is dedicated to **The Blessed Virgin Mary.** The entire month falls within the liturgical season of **Easter**, which is represented by the liturgical color white — the

color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence.

Our Blessed Virgin Mary is the Mother of God, Mother of Jesus, wife of St. Joseph, and the greatest of all Christian saints. The Virgin Mother was, after her Son, exalted by divine grace above all angels and men. The principal events of her life are celebrated as liturgical feasts of the universal Church. Mary's life and role in the history of salvation is prefigured in the Old Testament, while the events of her life are recorded in the New Testament. Traditionally, she was declared the daughter of Sts. Joachim Born in Jerusalem, Anne. Mary was presented in the Temple and took a vow of virginity.

Living in Nazareth, Mary was visited by the archangel Gabriel, who announced to her that she would become the Mother of Jesus, by the Holy Spirit. She became betrothed to St. Joseph and went to visit her cousin, Elizabeth, who was bearing St. John the Baptist. This special of Mary in salvation history is clearly depicted in the Gospel in which she is seen constantly at her son's side during his soteriological mission. Because of role exemplified her acceptance of Christ into her womb, her offering of him to God at the Temple, her urging him to perform his first miracle, and her standing at the foot of the Cross at Calvary Mary was joined fully in the sacrifice by Christ of himself.

Mary possesses a unique relationship with all three Persons of the Trinity, thereby giving her a claim to the title of Queenship. She was chosen by God the Father to be the Mother of his Son; God the Holy Spirit chose her to be his virginal spouse for the Incarnation of the Son; and God the Son chose her to be his mother, the means of incarnating into the world for the purposes of the redemption of humanity.

She is not our Mother in the physical sense, she is called a spiritual mother,

for she conceives, gives birth, and nurtures the spiritual lives of grace for each person. As Mediatrix of All Graces, she is ever present at the side of each person, giving nourishment and hope, from the moment of spiritual birth at Baptism to the moment of death.

For God has committed to Mary the treasury of all good things, in order that everyone may know that through her are obtained every hope, every grace, and all salvation. For this is his will, that we obtain everything through Mary.

Let's ask us in this month for the intercession of Our Blessed Virgin Mary and for all mothers throughout the world to imitate her example and be instrument of God's grace and hope. As we pray together to Our Blessed Mother in time of need:

"Holy Mary, help those in need,
Gives strength to the weak,
Comfort the sorrowful, pray
For God's people, assist the clergy,
Intercede for religious.
Mary all who seek your help
Experience your unfailing protection.
Amen."





Sir Knights,

On that fateful day in May 1968, after completing her European deployment, last reported position, 21 May 1968, about 50 miles south of the Azores. Six days later, she was reported overdue at Norfolk; Crew declared "presumed lost," 5 June 1968; Struck from the Naval Register 30 June 1968; Final Disposition, in October 1968 **Mizar (T-AGOR-11)** located sections of **Scorpion's** hull in more than 10,000 feet of water about 400 miles southwest of the Azores.

Annually, on Sunday of the Memorial weekend, Fr. Bader Assembly 2430 conducts a memorial service to remember the 99 crewmen of the USS Scorpion embarked on that Eternal Patrol with their beloved ship, while bravely serving our country. The Navy would send personnel from one of the submarines in port to participate, usually the Commanding Officer, the Chief of the Boat and some crew members will attend family members of the Scorpion crews.

This event is open to all members of 5480, not just Fourth Degree, I encourage all members to attend, it is something that would make you feel really proud to be part of it, bring your family. Sign up sheets are in the lounge and at meetings, we welcome both participants and volunteers. On that day, the War Museum at Huntington Park will open free of charge to all participants of the Scorpion Memorial Service. In return, Fr. Bader Assembly will donate \$100 to the museum.
