WHERE?

New York, New Haven via a coach tour package that includes 4 days and 3 nights from October 2 through October 5, 2014.

SCHEDULE

DAY 1

- This includes 3 nights' accommodation, breakfasts, private luxury coach accommodation, entrance fee to the glass museum, fully guided tour of New York City. Not included are dinners, lunches and gratuities.
 - At the time of booking, a deposit of \$150 per person which is non-refundable will be required.


