As I was collecting money off a street corner during the recent Developmentally Disabled Drive my mind started to wander and I thought about all the time and effort that goes into the drive, particularly the time dedicated by Mike Carpenter.

This is the 23rd year that Mike has been the chairman of the drive. He is the chairman but it is virtually a one-person committee. Mike begins writing letters to the town and storeowners months before the drive begins to acquire permits and request permission to collect in front of the stores. In February, he makes out his coverage schedule and begins making phone calls and sending e-mails to get help to fill the time slots. This takes hours upon hours and often involves telephoning or e-mailing people three or four times before he makes contact. During the three days of the drive Mike takes vacation days from work so that he can be available to make sure all collection places are covered and to drive around to the stores and streets on which we collect to take the money and lighten the weight of the collection tubs.

Members of our council, relatives and friends of Mike's spend a few hours helping to collect money and all the help is appreciated but Mike devotes hundreds of hours to the drive each and every year. Too often we take this for granted

I wanted to take the time and say "THANKS MIKE" on behalf of all the members of our council as well as all the Developmentally Disabled people who benefit from your efforts.




