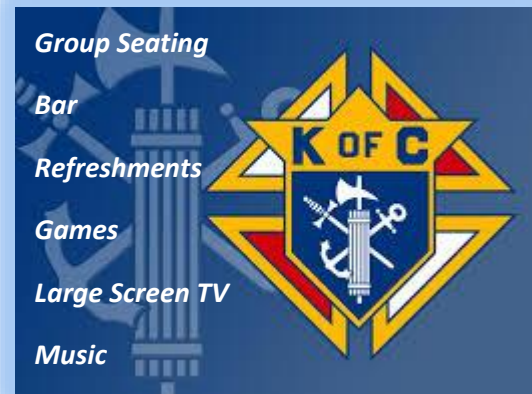

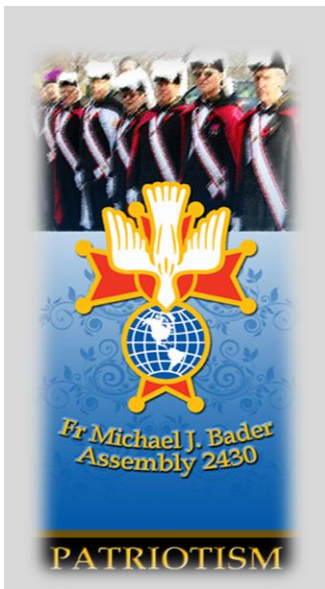

On Saturday, April 9, 2016, The Virginia District welcomed the Spring Class of 2016. A total of 70 members were exemplified into the Fourth Degree. The exemplification, which was held at St. Elias Maronite Catholic Church located in Roanoke (on a cold, windy and snowy day), was in honor of Past State Deputy William T "Bill" DeBerry. Bill, whose motto was "Recruit, Retain and Reclaim", served as State Deputy of the Jurisdiction of Virginia for the 2001-2002 fraternal year. Father Bader Assembly was well represented by eight (8) new Sir Knights. Representing San Francisco de Asis Council 11781 were Sir Knights George Vazquez, Boni Medel-Armenta, Salvador Moreno, Henry Miranda and Jose Lomeli. Representing Immaculate Conception Council 16226 were Sir Knights Roy Lewis, Dave Okerblom and Jay Madigan. We welcome these brothers and their families into our assembly and look forward to their attendance at our monthly dine-in's and meetings.

A reflection of pride... This month we reflect on the sacrifices and services of the American soldiers and veterans and the United States military men and women. Our military is, has always been and will always recruit the best and finest bunch of young men and women of this nation and we will continue to shower them with appreciation, support and prayers. Memorial Day is another opportunity for us to express the special places they have in the hearts of American citizens and more by honoring the people who work in the various branches of the military. The tragedies over the years continue to stir and awaken the spirit of patriotism in our hearts and the unity and oneness of all Americans in a special bond. The words "United We Stand" and God Bless America" still hold the power to stir our hearts on this very special "Memorial Day". We encourage and invite you to attend our annual "Scorpion Commemoration". The USS Scorpion (SSN-589) was a skipjack-class nuclear submarine of the United States Navy and the sixth vessel of the U.S. Navy to carry that name. It was lost on May 22, 1968, with 99 crewmen dying in the incident. This year, we will be joined by our patriotic brothers from Father John P Washington Assembly of Yorktown in commemorating "The Four Chaplains", sometimes referred to as the "Immortal Chaplains" or the "Dorchester Chaplains". These were four United States Army chaplains who gave their lives to save other civilian and military personnel as the troop ship SS Dorchester sank on February 3, 1943, during World War II. They helped other soldiers board lifeboats and gave up their own lives when supplies ran out. The chaplains joined arms, said prayers, and sang hymns as they went down with the ship. There will be free tours of the War Museum in addition to food and beverages provided by Assembly Sir Knights. We invite each of you and family members to join us in commemoration of this event starting at 2:30 p.m. on Sunday, May 29.

Ride 2 Recovery Memorial Challenge... On Monday, May 29, 2016, more than 200 injured veterans will set off on the six-day, 350 mile RIDE 2 RECOVERY MEMORIAL CHALLENGE from Arlington National Cemetery traveling through Williamsburg to Virginia Beach.
