#### From the Desk of SK Deacon Dan....

The month of May is devoted to Our Blessed Mother. It is interesting that we remember her during the season of Easter. Mary was the portal through which the Word was made flesh to dwell among us, fully human and fully divine. The humanity of Jesus Christ proceeds from his birth from the Virgin Mary. This act completed the reality of God's mission to bring salvation through Jesus' birth, passion, death, and resurrection. Truly central to the plan of salvation was the heart and soul of a teenage girl who stripped away herself. Mary in essence grafted her heart to the creator of life and mercy. She is indeed the mother of God.

Various names are used to describe Mary's role as mother of Jesus. She is called "Mother of God" which translates the more accurately stated Greek term: "Theotokos" or "Birthgiver of God." The Council of Ephesus (431) attributed to Mary the title, Mother of God. This needs to be read against the Council's declaration that in Christ there are two

natures, one divine and one human, but only one person. This decision was further explained by the <u>Council of Chalcedon</u> (451), which says with regard to Mary's divine motherhood:

"...begotten from the Father before the ages as regards his godhead, and in the last days, the same, because of us and because of our salvation begotten from the Virgin Mary, the Theotokos, as regards his manhood; one and the same Christ, Son, Lord, only-begotten..."

The intrinsic message of the Mother of God lies in the depth of her soul. "Be it done unto me according to your will." These words depict Mary's servant hood and her intimate love for God. In the silence of her heart she experienced the unspoken voice of the origin of life and love. We are definitely challenged by the "yes" of this young woman's faith. I am reading a book by Cardinal Sarah, "The Power of Silence," which points to the importance of silence as part of our daily prayer. In a world wrought with extrinsic noise both visual and auditory, we are challenged to find a time and place to turn inward. Saint Therese of Calcutta spent three hours everyday kneeling in front of the Blessed Sacrament. Her hope was not to ask, but to offer herself and listen for the unspoken voice of God.

Mary is also the spiritual mother for each of us. Children often reflect the traits of their parents. The example has been set, and by the grace of the sacraments we place ourselves in the presence of God through Christ Our Lord and Savior. In these moments we can be resurrected to transcend the imperfections that stand between God and us. "Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb Jesus." The Mother of Jesus stood by his side in the most painful times, and now stands with each of us. The Word made flesh that through Holy Communion dwells in our hearts and souls.
