Active Duty Military, Police and Firefighters are urged to wear their dress uniforms, and Priests their traditional garb.

You may purchase or rent a tuxedo as you prefer. You can expect to wear your tuxedo at Exemplifications and other formal events during the year, depending on your participation. You will NOT have to wear it at regular meetings.

Fee for candidates is \$70.00 which includes the Candidate's banquet. Wives, Friends, and Knights are invited to attend the banquet afterward. The cost of the meal will be \$40.00 per person with the exception of the candidate's meal, which is included in the Candidate's fee. (ALL Candidates must pay ALL of the required Fees.) Origins of Mother's Day in America

ANNA M. JARVIS'S MOTHER'S DAY IN 1908

After Anna Reeves Jarvis died, her daughter Anna M. Jarvis campaigned for the creation of an official Mother's Day in remembrance of her mother and in honor of peace. In 1908, Anna petitioned the superintendent of the church where her Mother had spent over 20 years teaching Sunday School. Her request was honored, and on May 10, 1908, the first official Mother's Day celebration took place at Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia and a church in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The West Virginia event drew a congregation of 407 and Anna Jarvis arranged for white carnations—her Mother's favorite flower—to adorn the patrons. Two carnations were given to every Mother in attendance. Today, white carnations are used to honor deceased Mothers, while pink or red carnations pay tribute to Mothers who are still alive. Andrew's Methodist Church exists to this day, and was incorporated into the International Mother's Day Shrine in 1962.

In 1908 a U.S. Senator from Nebraska, Elmer Burkett, proposed making Mother's Day a national holiday at the request of the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA). The proposal was defeated, but by 1909 forty-six states were holding Mother's Day services as well as parts of Canada and Mexico. In 1912 West Virginia became the first state to officially recognize Mother's Day, and in 1914 Woodrow Wilson signed it into national observance, declaring the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day.


Help us save money and get up-to-date information concerning events, prayer requests and notices that are of interest to our council and its' Brothers.


Representing us at this year's State Convention will be Deputy Grand Knight Frank Saavedra and Past Grand Knight Pete Karculias.



The Abacus and the Cross: The Story of the Pope Who Brought the Light of Science to the Dark Ages

This is the story of Gerbert of Aurillac and his rag to riches rise from peasant begins to become Pope Sylvester II. He was a mathematician, astronomer and spy who brought science to the west before the year 1000.



During this time, in the Dark Ages, the Catholic Church was not anti-science and by the year 1000, Pope Sylvester II was considered the leading mathematician and astronomer of his day. Called the "Scientist Pope", Gerbert is the first Christian known to teach math using the nine Arabic numerals and zero.

This is a pretty interesting story, both for the history and the religion, and follows Gerbert, entering the monastery early, thriving on learning and reading and also how he became a teacher and tutor to the son of kings. It offers a good perspective of life in the Dark Ages and how one man influenced the direction of history.

The book also touches on disputes between church and state, politics, wars that were going on and behind the scenes maneuvering that drove events before and after 1000 C. E.
