Ken Newton Writes Column On Blue Mass Origins

The Rev. Charles Francis Buddy, ordained in September 1914, grew up in St. Joseph and would eventually become the first bishop of the Diocese of San Diego, a position he would hold for 30 years.

While ministering in St. Joseph, the young priest had a small part in one of the darkest days in the city's history.

On Oct. 26, 1921, St. Joseph police got a tip that a man wanted in several robberies, Carlos "Slippery" Henderson, had been hiding in his stepfather's house at Seventh and Sycamore streets.

As police approached to apprehend the man, Henderson opened fire. Hundreds of rounds would be fired in the ensuing gun battle.

Henderson eventually would be shot dead in trying to escape the house. Before this, he shot four law officers, Chief of Detectives Thomas Johnson, police clerk Albert Hall, Detective Ed Eads and Police Chief Clay Macdonald.

The wounds to Johnson and Hall proved fatal.

Over the course of two days, St. Joseph held two funerals for two fallen law enforcers. Actually, the deaths fell within a dreary period in city history; between 1917 and 1926, seven local policemen died in the line of duty.

At the St. Joseph Cathedral, Buddy presided at the funeral Mass for the 23-year-old Hall, who had rushed to the scene after the standoff began.

"We believe that Almighty God has taken sight of this hero's devotion to duty and that he will be rewarded, not by the length of his life but by its fullness in spite of his few years," the priest said.

"Let us so live, as he did, that we will be prepared and that if we are called suddenly, the call will find us at our post of duty."

People of faith have long shown their gratitude for those who protect and serve. Back in 1934, a priest thought it necessary to help organize a special service for what we now refer to as first responders.

It took place on Sept. 29, the feast day of St. Michael the Archangel, the patron of police officers.


("Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil," reads part of the prayer to St. Michael.)

At least 1,000 police officers and firefighters turned out for the service at St. Patrick's Church in Washington, D.C., all in their dress uniforms. The event became known as the Blue Mass, and it continued in many parts of the United States.

In St. Joseph, some have worked to establish this tradition. A Blue Mass will be held for the second straight year at 11:30 a.m. this Sunday, May 5, at St.

Francis Xavier Catholic Church.

The parish's Knights of Columbus council will sponsor the service, in addition to a reception that follows in the parish hall.



Members of police and fire departments, sheriffs' departments, the Missouri State Highway Patrol, emergency medical technicians, 911 dispatchers, hazardous material responders and others have been invited to attend. They need not be Catholic.

While those who put themselves in positions of harm for the greater good of this community should be appreciated every day, the Knights council wants this to become an annual expression of thanksgiving.

A memorial at Civic Center Park speaks to the dangers that accompany their work. The Peace Officers Memorial bears a verse from the Gospel of John: "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends."

It also has a line of blank markers for future names, sobering reminders that the risks of this world do not decrease with the years.

Let that be our prayer, at Sunday's service and always, that these markers go forever unfilled.

First Responder Blue Mass Pre-Event Publicity Appears In St Joseph Newspaper

By Abby Trapp (NPG) —The Knights of Columbus St. Francis Xavier council will hold its second annual Blue Mass at St. Francis Xavier Church on Sunday, May 5th.

The Blue Mass honors first responders in the community. "There are several cities around the country that do First Responder Blue Masses. It started back in Baltimore back in 1934," says Len Archer, the PR and Communications Director for the council.

The Mass will honor a variety of first responders from law enforcement to hazardous materials management. "Our intent is to honor those who protect our public safety. The policemen, the first responders, the EMTs, the paramedics, sheriffs, highway patrol, hazardous material management, all of those people are encouraged to come," Archer says.

First responders are asked to bring agency flags from the departments they represent. "We always ask them to bring their agency flag. The opening procession and Mass is a procession of the flags," Archer

says. "We have the church flag, the U.S. flag and any of their agency flags, and they're posted on each side of the altar."

Archer believes the Blue Mass is important because first responders and those in public safety are on call. "I mean, they work 24/7 and they could get a call any time day or night," he says. "They normally work a shift, but some of those shifts are 24-hour shifts. Some people have forgotten the service they provide and the duties they perform."

Archer worked as a first responder before joining the Knights of Columbus. "I was in the military in the Army National Guard for a number of years and basically worked flood duty in '93," Archer says.

The Rev. Joe Miller of St. Francis Xavier says that the Mass is open to people of all faiths. "They'd be welcome to come and participate as much as they like to participate," Miller says.

The Blue Mass will be at 11:30 a.m. Sunday, May 5, at St. Francis Xavier, 2618 Seneca Street.
