My Brother Knights:

Welocme to your award winning State newsletter. Every year a council newsletter is selected to be the best in the state. The award was the last one given out at the convention dinner by Publicity Chairman Dennis Buchheit. John Milosevich and I looked at each other in surprised to hear our St. Robert Bellarmine Council 14745 was announced. Congratulations to all that contribute articles to our newsletter!

I'm not going to boar you with a lengthy report on the State Convention that was held on April 25th to the 27th in Jefferson City. Here are some of the highlights:

- Special Olympics received \$47,030.08 from all the councils, \$3,643.50 was the highest donation and \$25.00 the lowest. Our Council contributed \$784.19 for the Silver award.
- The Drive for Persons with Developmental Disabilities collected \$619,538.91
- Wheelchair drive collected \$14,081.50, which will supply almost 94 wheelchairs.
- Ultrasound machines that are provided by our fundraising resulted in saving 1,600 babies. (The Kansas City inner-city recently opened a pregnancy resource center.)
- In January we distributed over 70,000 roses in over 160 parishes
- State athletics raised over \$23,000 from our state events of golf, BBQ contest, horseshoes, clay shooting and bowling. (We should consider attending some of these events, they are a lot of fun and the proceeds go to a good cause!)
- State Family of the Year was Eric and Frances Tichy
- Youth of the Year was Clarissa Emanuel, a seventh grade student
- Our own 10th grade essay contest winner was Natalie Pace. Her essay will be in an upcoming church bulletin.
- Our own Benjamin Hays (Frank's Son) received one of three Luke E. Hart Scholarships.
- The state has 934 new members
- Lastly, Kieth Milson was voted in as the new State Deputy

Selected for our Knight of the month is Wendell Vice. Wendell as you know, is our Financial Secretary. I can't say enough of how valuable his position is. He recently organized two fish fries during Lent to raise much needed funds for our different ministries. He serves as an usher and at times leads the rosary before Sunday Masses and before our general KofC meeting. He has helped in serving coffee and donuts on several Sundays, plus the forth Sunday breakfast. Wendell has donated bottles of water from his business. He helps AARP members do their taxes. Congratulations Wendell for all you do.

KofC Meet Life Campaign: Baby Bottles for Life

The month of May will be dedicated to Pro-Life. We will kick the month off with the "Baby Bottle Campaign" where our parish families will be encouraged to accept a baby bottle from us and over the month of May, fill it with money. The funds will then be used to purchase additional sonogram machines for our Pregnancy Centers across the state of Missouri.

Here are some helpful facts that will help you understand why this program is so important and help you explain it's importance to your fellow parishioners and family:

- 92% of the time when an abortion minded woman meets her baby on the ultrasound screen, sees his little fingers and toes, and hears his heartbeat—she chooses life for her baby!
- The Missouri Knights of Columbus launched the Meet Life Campaign in July of 2011, with the goal of reducing abortions in Missouri by 50% by the end of 2016. Since then, abortions are down 17% in our state.
- Our plan includes placement of 50 new ultrasound machines in qualified pregnancy centers and to provide training of those centers.
- We are also providing strategic marketing to direct abortion minded women to these pregnancy centers before they go to the abortion clinic.
- We estimate that 5,000 babies will be saved each year as a result of our efforts.

We will be asking our parish families for their prayers and their generous contributions to our campaign to help reduce abortions now!

Baby bottles will be available after the Masses during May. We will be asking parishioners to fill their bottle(s) with spare change, bills or a personal check payable to Columbian Charities and to return the filled bottle(s) the weekend of May 31-June 1.

Also, don't forget that on Mother's Day we will again provide carnations for a donation. All of the profit will be donated to our local Pro-Life committee.

"\$40 For Lent" Update

Once again our "\$40 For Lent" campaign was a huge success! Besides the pounds of products parishioners donated, we collected \$3,045 in cash and checks and another \$1,000 in gift cards. 100% of the donations have been turned over to our parish food pantry to serve the needs of our local community.
