### **Refund Support Vocations Program**

How do you feel about the Priests in your Parish? Do they work hard serving the Parish in many ways: celebrating Mass; meeting with parishioners; handling the business affairs of the Parish, meeting with his Knights of Columbus Council. They do a lot that isn't visible, visiting the homebound, the elderly and the ill; going to give the last rites.

We thank them for their Vocation by assisting at Mass as Ushers, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Sacristans. We thank them at our Annual Pride in our Priests Dinners and Bishop's Night celebrations. But, as we all know, there aren't enough Priests right now. Luckily, there are young people away from their families right now as you read this, studying to become our Priests and Nuns of tomorrow.

The Knights of Columbus has a program that started right here in New Jersey, the RSVP Program. Councils, Columbian Squire Circles and Fourth Degree Assemblies donate funds to support the vocations of Seminarians, Postulates, and Novices. Funds raised by Knights of Columbus units are eligible for a Supreme Council refund of \$100.00 for every \$500.00 contributed by a Council or Assembly, and \$20.00 for every \$100.00 contributed by a Circle.

The Council Report Forms Booklet, in the Surge with Service packet issued by the Supreme Council, contains the Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP) application (Form 2863A). Grand Knights should complete this application, ensuring that the Seminarians, Postulants and or Novices names are listed, along with a copy of the Council's check, the amount, the date, and the name of the Seminary or Convent. Grand Knights should also indicate if the Council is applying for an RSVP Vocations Plaque.

NOTE: The report (Form 2863A) is due by June 30th to the Supreme Council.

### What are you waiting for?

A recent study done by Experian Credit bureau showed that 73% of Americans die with debt. That debt averages \$62,000 for each man or woman who dies.

A recent study by the Life Insurance Market Research Associates, (LIMRA), showed that 7 out of 10 families would not be able to pay their bills if one of the wage earners died, was injured or is too sick to go to work.

The Social Security administration did a study that shows that the segment of the population that is falling below the poverty line at the highest rate is single women, (divorced, widowed or never married), over the age of 70.

So.....what are you waiting for? Why have you not met with your Knights of Columbus insurance agent?



Do you love your family?

Do you want to be sure that if something happened to you or your spouse they could live in your home? Stay in the town and school district where your kids go to school now?

Do you want to be certain that if you got sick or were in an accident and couldn't go to work there would be money coming in to pay your bills?

Are you worried that when one spouse dies, the surviving spouse loses income.

Are you waiting until someone you know has to pay their bills with a go-fund-me page? Are you waiting until a friend or relative dies and the family loses everything. Sometimes we need to see a tragedy up close and personal before we are moved to act.

Don't wait. There's an old saying don't put off until tomorrow, what you can do today. In insurance terms that is even more important. Today, you are healthy, (maybe not so next week or next month). Today, you have the ability to meet with an agent and learn what holes you have in your insurance program. You can't wait until you are sick or dying to get insurance, that's not how this works.

We are all doing some spring cleaning around the house and the yard. Meet with your Knights of Columbus agent and spring clean your insurance program and make certain you and your family are protected. That's what being a Knight is, taking care of those whose care is entrusted to us. Be that Knight in shining armor and meet with your agent. That's who we are and what we do.



You may not be aware that Autism is the fastest growing disability in this country with one



in 68 children born with some type of autism, and the highest ranking state is New Jersey with one in 41. Gentlemen, they desperately need your support. These families struggle with trying to understand their child's needs. They struggle with school systems that don't understand their special learning needs, and with a general public that thinks they don't know how to discipline their child. Most of these children are highly intelligent, but for some reason God has wired their thought processes differently. The State Council is asking you to support "Parents of Autistic Children" (POAC.org). POAC's mission is to improve the lives of children and adults with autism by

providing scientifically-based training to parents, teachers, and other direct service providers. POAC supports ongoing quality research on the causes of autism, its symptoms, prevention, and a potential cure. In addition, POAC provides free recreational events for children and adults with autism and their siblings throughout the year. The safety of children and adults with Autism has been and continues to be a primary concern and top priority at POAC. They are pioneers in safety training for police, fire fighters, and EMTs, and provide training to first responders from every New Jersey County. Contact Bernie Ernst, FDD for more information.

liver, kidney or lung that is now keeping them alive. Or maybe it was a cornea transplant that now allows them to see the face of their child or grandchild. 

### From the Webmaster's Desk

### Passing the Baton

Serving in an elected or appointed position in the Knights of Columbus is very much like a relay race. Many members advance "through the chairs" until the day that they are elected as the Grand Knight of their Council; Financial Secretaries, on the recommendation of their Council's Grand Knight and Trustees, are approved by the State Deputy and appointed by the Supreme Knight for 3-year terms; District Deputies receive suggestions from their peers, are – in the case of New Jersey - recommended by their Diocesan State Officer and the State Deputy and appointed by the Supreme Knight.

It is hoped that the experience learned by each officer is passed on in a continuous manner to their successor. There is a very short learning curve. Even committee chairmen have to hit the ground running.

This is where the NJ State Council's website comes in as an invaluable visible and vibrant tool to help members, officers and chairmen do their tasks in an organized manner.

So how do predecessors ensure success by those who follow them? By leaving behind an organized paper trail; producing project reports highlighting the good and the no-so-good of every project or event conducted by your Council; and training your successor on how to utilize the state website, and the Supreme website.

As soon as a member is elected to an officer or committee position, they should register on the state website. It's easy: Go to <a href="www.njkofc.org">www.njkofc.org</a> and click :"Register"; to receive credentials for the Supreme Council website, ensure that the Supreme Council forms 185 and 365 are completed (by Grand Knight or Financial Secretary through Member Management) – paper submissions are no longer accepted.

Supreme just recently created access for certain sections of Member Management for other Council officers. Once registered, based on the level of responsibility, updates will arrive with "warp speed" so that you will have time to act and react to important state and supreme notifications and reminders.

"Back in the day..." Grand Knights received a 350+ page 3-ring binder detailing all the programs conducted by the state. Then came the Grand Knights' Handbook on CD and also available on the state website.


With the prevalence of smart phones, tablets, etc., new this year, and moving forward, the State Council will issue USB "Thumb Drives" to all Grand Knights and District Deputies containing all the data and helpful resources to ensure success.

As always, since 2005, the Grand Knight Handbook, updated as needed, will be available on-line. When in doubt, always seek advice from your predecessors. Their gray hair did not come about just from old age. They have been there and done that. As you move up the ranks, be kind to those who follow in your path – make sure they have a firm grip as you hand off the baton.

As always, consult your District Deputy, and if necessary your State Officers. Don't stumble in your quest due to a failure to ask. There are no dumb questions...only dumb answers!
