Creighton Model – Rachel McDonald

Through the generosity and support of The Knights of Columbus, it has been one year since I was gifted the opportunity to begin my educational training as a Fertility Care Practitioner at the Saint Pope Paul VI Institute in Omaha, Nebraska. I have completed both educational phases under the direction of Dr. Hilgers and his staff of physicians, educators and bioethicist, Sister Renee Mirkes, PhD in Omaha (October 2017 and April 2018). I am currently in the internship period and will be eligible to sit for my national certification in 2019.

Over the past year I have been given the opportunity to teach the Creighton Model Fertility Care System to engaged couples, single women and married couples (both those desiring to avoid pregnancy as well as those experiencing infertility) in the diocese of Wilmington. In the upcoming months I will be broadening my reach for clients by offering distance instruction via on-line technology, as well as collaborating with The Birth Center of Wilmington to offer introductory sessions on the Creighton Model. My information is also listed as a Natural Family Planning resource with the Diocese of Wilmington.

It has been such an honor to have an active role in assisting to build a culture of life via The Creighton Model. Educating and empowering women and couples on their God-given gift of fertility has been an incredibly rewarding experience. I am extremely grateful for this opportunity and I am very appreciative for all of your financial support and prayers! Thank you so very much!
