When he began his career in banking he and Katy moved to Upper Sandusky, Ohio They then raised their three children in the Northern Panhandle of West Virginia, primarily in Wheeling. Br. He was the varsity women's basketball coach at three West Virginia high schools and finished second twice in the state finals. He had five players who received Division 1 scholarships.
