THE SCRIP PROGRAM

Brother Knights we are now six weeks into the SCRIP program. I thought I'd give you an update as to how the program is doing. Thus far we have purchased \$19,809 of gift cards at a cost of \$18,675. The difference less expenses yields us \$1,094. Our first projections used an estimated 3% margin for the sold cards. I'm happy to report that our margin right now is 6.1%. This is due to parishioners are buying many gift cards with higher discount amounts.

CHRISTMAS SCRIPS

We are coming into the Christmas buying season. I would encourage you to think about giving or using our gift cards as presents epecially if you have family that is out of town. There are 780 merchants nation-

wide that participate in the program. I'm sure there is one that would suit your needs. You are going to be spending the money anyway. Remember the proceeds are split 50-50 with the parish. We have some cards in stock. We can special order others and have
