Bible: Jesus Carries His Cross, by Mark Galbaugh

Reading the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, & Luke together will readily show that virtually all of Mark's Gospel can be found in Matthew's & Luke's (thus, "synoptic"). It seems that these authors combined material from their own sources with the existing text of Mark to create their own accounts of the life, death, & resurrection of Jesus for their particular audiences. John's Gospel, however, goes in a different direction. Contrasting the differences between the Gospels in regards to, say, the Passion of our Lord, may open up new insights in the texts, in both the literal & the spiritual senses.

All three synoptics record that the Roman soldiers pressed Simon of Cyrene into service to help Jesus carry his cross, who was probably at this point too beaten & weak to endure the burden himself (Mk 15:21-22; Mt 27:32; Lk 23:26). Luke joins Mark in noting that Simon was just coming in from the country. What a shock this must have been for Simon to finally arrive at Jerusalem for the great feast, only to be forced to assist in a condemned criminal's execution! Only Mark, however, notes that Simon was the father for Alexander & Rufus. Significance? There is a tradition that the brothers became bishops in North Africa. It is also possible that this same Rufus is referred to in Romans 16:13. Apparently, somewhere along the road to Golgotha, Simon's eyes were opened to see that this condemned man was no ordinary criminal, but the long-awaited Messiah, & becoming Christian, passed his faith to his children. Luke alone notes that Simon carried the cross behind Jesus.

John, on the other hand, says that Jesus carried his own cross as they set out for Golgotha. This is important, because John was the only apostle actually present at Jesus' crucifixion. His Gospel is also the only one that contains an explicit statement of apostolic authorship (see Jn 21:24). In other words, John's Gospel is the only eyewitness testimony to the execution of Jesus; the others disciples had fled & were, at best, looking on from afar. Does this mean that John is right & the synoptic Gospels are wrong? Not if we keep in mind that not every detail of Jesus' Passion was recorded the way it would be today (as an aside: what sort of spectacle do you think the media would make of Jesus' execution today?). Different elements are presented according to the author's intention under inspiration of the God the Spirit. Jesus may have started out carrying his own cross, but was helped when he couldn't go on any longer. One commentary notes that John's Gospel is particularly emphatic of Jesus' exchange with Pilate regarding his kingship & that Jesus carries his cross like a triumphant banner to resolve the confusion that the earthly monarch has about the King of the universe. In other words, the accounts must not be seen as contradicting each other; but should instead be taken together side by side, each having something to reveal.

In a rare moment of coincidence, all four Gospels note that "the place of the skull" is where Jesus' path would lead. Apart from the physical resemblance or purpose of this hilltop, it is noteworthy that a skull is often found at the base of the cross in artistic renderings of the Crucifixion. This is the skull of Adam, whose disobedience brought death upon man, and whose mortal sin (& our own personal sin) is atoned for by the death of Jesus, our Paschal sacrifice.

This Holy Week & Eastertide, read the various Gospel accounts of the Passion & the Resurrection together to see where they are the same & where they are different. The texts frequently make reference to the Psalms or other Old Testament texts - look them up. Then stand back & see the larger point that all four Gospels wish to impart: "These are recorded that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing you may have life in his name (Jn 20:31)."
