

FATHER JULIAN NEW ASSOCIATE PASTOR AT ST. THOMAS CHURCH

When you walk into Fr, Julian's office you are impressed by the certificates on the wall, the bookshelf full of religious and theological books, the coat of armor statue with an Ephesians quote by St Paul, and a Benedictine crucifix showing Christ standing on a skull which symbolizes that Christ has defeated death. A good beginning, you

might think, for an associate pastor who joined our parish a mere four weeks ago.

A native of Pereira, Colombia, Fr. Julian has one brother and two sisters. When he was 14 years old he felt a calling from God to become a priest. At age 18 he entered Pereira Seminary where he studied for five years. He later received a degree in education at the Catholic University in Pereira. He then taught Philosophy and Ethics.

St. Meinrad Seminary

Fr. Andres Cano, a classmate in Pereira Seminary, suggested in 2007 that Fr. Julian come to the United States. Fr. Julian traveled to America in 2010 and attended St. Meinrad Seminary and School of Theology in Indiana. He was ordinated by Bishop Sitka on May 31, 2014 at the Knoxville Cathedral. His sister Francy, who lives in New Jersey, attended his ordination.

On July 1, 2014, Bishop Sitka assigned him as the Associate Pastor at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Johnson City, Tennessee. Exactly twelve months later on July 1, 2014, Fr. Julian was assigned by the bishop to be the Associate Pastor at St. Thomas.

Happy and excited to be at St. Thomas, Fr. Julian continues to work on his English. He is looking forward to initiating classes in English and Theology for our Hispanic parishioners.

"Father Doug has been very supportive and has performed the role as my mentor," he said." "St. Thomas is a very active parish with a great staff, outstanding ministers and volunteers and a wonderful bilingual community. "
