Pro-Life Notes-A Need for Prayer

In regard to **Evangelium Vitae**, Pope St. John Paul II said, "In the case of an intrinsically unjust law, such as a law permitting abortion or euthanasia, it is therefore never licit to obey it, or to take part in a propaganda campaign in favor of such a law, or to vote for it." On Sept 24, 2021, Nancy Pelosi went to the House floor to advocate enactment of the Women's Health Protection Act, which if it became law, would nullify every modest pro-life restriction ever enacted by the states. Pelosi stated that she "came to this as a Catholic." The bill passed the House 218-211. Pope Francis said on September 15, 2021, "Whoever has an abortion, kills. No mincing words. It is a human life that must be respected. It's more than a problem, it's homicide." During the first four years that Pelosi served as speaker of the House ('07-'10) approximately 4,676,300 unborn babies were aborted in the U.S. according to the Guttmacher Institute. I hope you can find it in your heart to pray for the speaker that God will soften her heart to advocate for life.
