Did You Know?

At the March 1, 1882 meeting Fr. McGivney set forth the financial benefits that were to be available through the infant membership of his organization. A member could choose one of three "grades" of aid in the event of death, regulated by the grade to which he belonged to the Endowment fund. Grade one provided a \$500 death benefit for which a member was assessed 50 cents per month, grade two provided a \$1000 death benefit for an assessment of \$1 per month, and grade three, a \$1500 death benefit for an assessment of \$1.50 per month. Membership also included a sick benefit. A member could draw not more than \$5/ week for 13 weeks. After thirteen weeks the benefit was to be regulated by the council. The ages of admission were from 18 to 50 years of age. In the way Fr. McGivney organized the insurance, nearly anyone could afford coverage. His sick benefit was equivalent to about 63% of the average wage of a man in his 30's or 40's. The \$1500 death payout was about equal to 4 years of earnings and about \$200 more than the average price of a home in the 1880's. On March 29, 1882 the state of Connecticut granted the Knights of Columbus a charter.

ADMISSIONS: no report, although we were joined tonight by a new attendee, Dr. Dave DeGrave who introduced himself and has just retired from his dental practice.






