Holy Thursday, the day on which Catholics celebrate the institution of the Sacrament of Holy Communion at the Last Supper, falls most often in April, and so it is no surprise that the Catholic Church dedicates this month to devotion to the Blessed Sacrament.

The Real Presence

The Catholic Church has developed the practice of Eucharistic adoration. Every Catholic Church contains a tabernacle in which the Body of Christ is reserved between Masses, and the faithful are encouraged to come and pray before the Blessed Sacrament. Frequent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament is a path to spiritual growth.

Eucharistic Adoration

The practice of Eucharistic adoration on earth not only brings us grace but prepares us for our life in Heaven. As Pope Pius XII wrote in *Mediator Dei* (1947):

These exercises of piety have brought a wonderful increase in faith and supernatural life to the Church militant upon earth and they are reechoed to a certain extent by the Church triumphant in heaven which sings continually a hymn of praise to God and to the Lamb "who was slain."

This month, why not make a special effort to spend some time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament? It doesn't need to be long or elaborate: You can start simply by making the Sign of the Cross and uttering a short profession of faith, such as "My Lord and my God!" as you pass a Catholic church. If you have the time to stop for five minutes, all the better.

The 100th State Convention at the Holiday Inn, Erlanger was called to order by State Deputy Gary Berkemeier at 9:00 am on Saturday, May 17, 2003. And so, began the next 100 years of the Kentucky State Council. The other serving officers during the centennial year were Reverend Donald Hellmann, Chaplain; Gerald Roof, Secretary; Dannie Harris, Treasurer; Steve Teasley, Advocate; Billy Hancock, Warden; Gene Roberts, IPSD and Dennis Longwell, Executive Secretary. The same individuals were reelected or appointed to serve in their respective offices for another year. The Supreme representative was Donald R. Kehoe, PSD (Virginia) the Assistant Supreme Secretary.

As with most of our conventions there is still about another forty-five days remaining in the fraternal year. Thus, some Councils had not completed all requirements for Supreme awards. As of April 10, 2003, eighteen Councils had earned the McGivney Award (Membership) – Councils 1004, 1055, 1367, 1377, 1483, 2459, 4270, 4665, 5453, 6897, 7847, 10725, 10988, 12562, 12623, 12923, 12965, and 13053. Five Councils had earned the Founders Award (Insurance) – Councils 1483, 2499, 11470, 12562, and 13053. Meeting insurance quotas was as difficult then as it is today.

In 2003 the Jurisdiction consisted of 76 Councils with a membership of 9714. Over the next fifteen years the Jurisdiction has gained on average two new Councils per year. Membership has grown to 12019 for an average gain of 154 members per year.

The Jurisdiction was divided into seventeen districts each served by one of the following District Deputies: Charles Marshall, Chuck Meier, Tom Musser, Michael Gross, Robert Stites III, Thomas Herman, Daniel Pawley, Mike Westerman, John Smith, Paul Martin, Kerry Monin, Kenny Griffin, Walter Wheeler, Fred Meade, Charles Ryder, and Dwane Johnson. If anyone counted, they discovered there are only sixteen names listed. One District Deputy had not been appointed. A convention is about taking care of business – adopting resolutions, electing officers, etc. But also, about having fun and interacting with those around you.

There are planned activities for spouses and children and visiting hospitality rooms for snacks and libations is a big hit. If you haven't been to a convention lately as a delegate or member give it a try this year. I look forward to seeing you there.

During the past month and this month, many councils continue to hold church drives as a follow up to the K of C Founders Day (March 29) and the Bishops Call to Service Program. Remember that your new members joined to be a part of something, and as new Knights, they will be looking for doing something meaningful for the Church, Community, Youth, Council, and many other worthy causes. Don’t let them down by ignoring the “New Guy”. Not everyone is an extroverted self-starter- They will be looking to the veteran Knights to show them the ropes and get them on track to a rewarding time in our Order.

We have several Incentives that were recently communicated by our membership Chairman. For those who haven’t received that email, here is a summary:

INCENTIVES

The State Council has extended the 50% reduction in New Member Fees through the end of June. The New Member Fee will only be \$5.00 for any members recruited by 6/30/2018.

The Supreme Council is offering a \$4.50 per billable member credit to any council that achieves Star Council

Every council who recruits at least 3 more new members in the fourth quarter will receive a personalized bottle of one of Kentucky’s finest bourbons, Woodford Reserve. In addition, those councils will be eligible to win some good ole hard cash to help with your charitable activities. Every council will have one chance per new member (remember the minimum is three) in a drawing to win \$100 per diocese and a grand prize of \$500 for the entire state. 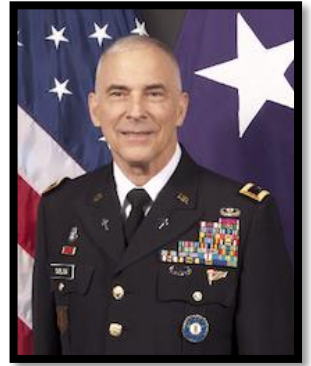

April Events; Happy Easter

April 2, 1513, Spanish explorer Ponce De Leon sighted Florida and claimed it for the Spanish Crown after landing at the site of present day St. Augustine, now the oldest city in the continental U.S. Also, in 1792, Congress established the first U.S. Mint at Philadelphia.

1860, In the American West, the Pony Express service began as the first rider departed St. Joseph, Missouri. For \$5 an ounce, letters were delivered 2,000 miles to California within ten days. The famed Pony Express riders each rode from 75 to 100 miles before handing the letters off to the next rider. A total of 190-way stations were located about 15 miles apart. The service lasted less than two years, ending upon the completion of the overland telegraph.

In 1948, President Harry S. Truman signed the European Recovery Program, better known as the Marshall Plan, intended to stop the spread of Communism and restore the economies of European countries devastated by World War II. Over four years, the program distributed \$12 billion to the nations of Western Europe. The program was first proposed by Secretary of State George C. Marshall during a historic speech at Harvard University on June 5, 1947.

April 4, 1968, Civil Rights leader Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King was shot and killed by a sniper in Memphis, Tennessee. As head of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, he had championed non-violent resistance to end racial oppression and had been awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964. He is best remembered for his *I Have a Dream* speech delivered at the 1963 Civil Rights March on Washington. That march and King's other efforts helped the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965. In 1986, Congress established the third Monday in January as a national holiday in his honor.
