

The remainder of the month falls within the liturgical season of Ordinary Time, which is represented by the liturgical color green. This symbol of hope is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. It is used in the offices and Masses of Ordinary Time. The last portion of the liturgical year represents the time of our pilgrimage to heaven during which we hope for reward.



Following Pentecost, the Church begins her slow descent from the great peaks of the Easter Season to the verdant pastures of Ordinary Time, the longest of the liturgical seasons. Like the lush June growth all around us, the green of the liturgical season points to the new life won for us by the Redemption of Jesus Christ, the new life of Charity. For Our Lord came to cast the fire of His love on the earth, and to that end, sent His Holy Spirit at Pentecost in the form of tongues of fire.

Ordinary Time is the hour to "go out to all the world and tell the good news." The feasts of June highlight this expansion of the Church. At least ten times, the Church vests in the red of the martyrs whose blood is the very seed of her growth. She also celebrates the feasts of the apostles Peter and Paul, and the birth of St. John the Baptist, proto-disciple and prophet.

We too are called to be witnesses like the apostles and martyrs. May the Heart of Jesus inflame our hearts so that we may be worthy of our Baptismal call to holiness. Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us.

The relationship between Special Olympics and the Knights of Columbus is one of our oldest and most cherished. We want to make the Knights' participation in our program as easy and fulfilling as we possibly can, and we appreciate the State Deputy's commitment to our athletes.

Insurance continues to be a major stumbling block to reach the Star Council Award. Only five Councils, see attached Honor Roll, have achieved their insurance quota. While the Swope Agency is undermanned, I'm sure the agents would cover the Councils that have customers for insurance and annuities.

Submission of the Columbian Award Applications, SP-7 is slow. This is another stumbling block to Star Council. The application is totally new. There are mandatory programs to be conducted. If your Council did not have representation at the State meetings, you probably did not understand the changes. I urge you to have representatives at the Organizational Meeting in July.

A recap: to date 63 Council have positive growth, 47 Councils have 0 or negative growth.

It has been my pleasure to serve as your Membership Director for this fraternal year. There are still 20 days remaining in the year. See what you can do to change negatives to positives.

KENTUCKY KNIGHTS DONATE \$149,650.70

The Passionist Nuns in Owensboro were elated when State Deputy Bernard Stottmann, Jr. and State Advocate Gene Roberts presented them a check for \$149,650.70 to help defray the cost of building the new St. Joseph Monastery. It took place during the awards presentation just after the banquet. Chairman Gene Roberts made the formal presentation "an enlarged check" to Sister Mary Agnes. Sister then addressed those in attendance with a very enlightening and enjoyable talk. We might mention accompanying Sister were her two bodyguards; Sisters Joseph Marie and Joseph Catherine. We then presented Sister Mary Agnes with a photo album of earlier meetings. George Schrode had a tee shirt made with one of the photos of all the Sisters which he displayed, and it was greeted with much enthusiasm. The Sister enjoyed it very much and expressed a desire to have one to be displayed at the new monastery. In retrospect this donation is the biggest we have ever made. It is a direct result of the good leadership of Chairman Gene Roberts and the perseverance of his committee people (PSD Robert Hood and Phil Carr). However, we must recognize that this was a great team effort of Councils, Fourth Degree Assemblies and individual Knights and could not and would not have happened without the generosity of Mrs. Clary White who donated her farm to the State Council which was sold for \$100,000.00.

The end of the fraternal year is virtually here. Star Council has become the focus for me and for many of you, I am sure. As of June 2nd, I would like to congratulate the members of Council 16125 in Knottsville for having met all of the requirements for Star Council, including membership, insurance, programs, and reports! Congratulations!

Several other councils are poised to earn the top award in the Order but still need to meet one of the Star Council criterion. If your Grand Knight has not been contacted by me, please let me know right away as I have been following more than 20 councils' progress towards the Star. The goal is 19 Star Councils, and I have every intent of reaching that goal for the State, however, there is still a lot of work to be done.

If you need help with recruiting, contact your District Deputy or Membership Director Billy Hancock. If you still need to meet your Insurance quota, about the only option left for you is to reactivate an Inactive Insurance member before June 30th. If you need to file the Columbian Award (SP-7), please contact me immediately. This report should not prevent a council from earning Star Council, but you need to complete it and send it to Supreme right away.

IMPORTANT: There is one more item that could disqualify your council from earning any Supreme Award this year if it is not addressed. Any council that is not compliant with their SAFE Environment training for the Grand Knight and Program Directors is not eligible to receive any Supreme Award. This has been communicated throughout the year, but there is still time to get it resolved if you are not yet compliant. If you have any doubts or need to become compliant, contact State Advocate Luke Williams immediately as he can help steer you through the process. Please do not let this keep your council from earning the award that you have worked very hard to achieve.

Lastly, now is the time to schedule your 2019-2020 program calendar. Meet with your Chaplain and leadership team as soon as possible. Every council should strive to put their program calendar in place by July 1st. If you need any help, let me know. I am glad to help! *Remember*, the Faith in Action programs are now the focus, including the *Mandatory* programs which must be a part of your program portfolio. Information on these programs can be found at the Supreme Council website at http://www.kofc.org/en/programs/index.html.

With this year's program overhaul, *I strongly recommend that every council send a representative* to the Organizational Meeting in July to learn more about Faith in Action. Councils that did not attend the Organizational or Regional meetings were left behind and likely struggled to catch up. If this was your council, plan for the Organizational Meeting now. Even if you were at last year's meetings, the Organizational Meeting still provides a great opportunity to refresh yourself and your council on what these programs involve.

Your Grand Knight and Faithful Navigator have the information packet, or you can access it at the State website at http://kykofc.com/fourth-degree-exemplification-june-15-2019-clarkson-ky/. This will be the last opportunity for Assemblies to meet their intake quota before the end of the fraternal year. I strongly recommend that Assemblies that only need one of two more members take advantage of this opportunity to meet their quota.

Remember that Assemblies can earn the Star Assembly Award by reaching their membership quota, earning the Civic Award (similar to the Columbian Award), entering the "To Be A Patriot" competition, publishing a monthly newsletter, and submitting the required Supreme reports. More information can be found at https://www.kofc.org/en/resources/service/council/10486-star-assembly-award.pdf. All Assemblies are encouraged to shoot for the Star Assembly Award! If you have any questions, just ask me.

Lastly, once your Assembly has elected their officers, please send me the report of officers chosen so that we can update the directories. This is the most important information that your Assembly has to offer. Please email the report to BillSchmidtPSD@comcast.net.

In order to grow the Fourth Degree, we must first grow in the First, Second, and Third Degrees. Recruit new members into your council and advance them through the higher degrees so that they can become Sir Knights in the Fourth Degree.
