THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Dear Brother Knights,

Pope Francis has proclaimed an Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy which began on December 8th, 2015 and ends November 20, 2016. Pope Francis has granted a Plenary Indulgence for the year in order that all the faithful experience true moments of God's profound and un-ending mercy in their lives.

"An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasure of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints." (Catechism of the Catholic Church # 1471)

Pope Francis explained in a letter dated September 1,2015: "To experience and obtain the Indulgence, the faithful are called to make a brief pilgrimage to the Holy Door, open in every Cathedral or in the (pilgrimage) churches designated by the diocesan bishop ...as a sign of the deep desire for true conversion..."

Prescribed conditions for gaining a Plenary Indulgence during the Jubilee year include:

- Be a Catholic in communion with the pope
- Make a visit to the cathedral or designated pilgrimage church

- Perform an act of mercy
- Receive the sacrament of reconciliation with true repentance for one's sins
- Receive the Holy Eucharist
- Pray for the intention of the Holy Father Bishop Donald J. Hying opened the holy doors of our Cathedral on December 20th. So you could make a pilgrimage to Holy Angles Cathedral as part of the conditions to receive the Plenary Indulgence.

Here is a partial list of churches that have been designated as pilgrimage churches where additional opportunities for the sacrament of *reconciliation will be offered with the assistance of additional deanery priests as needed. The additional schedule will be:

• St. Paul, Valparaiso

*First Fridays 9-10a.m.

• Holy Spirit, Winfield

*First Tuesdays 5:30-6:30p.m.

• Our Lady of Sorrows, Valparaiso

*First Wednesdays 5:25—6:25p.m.

• St. Patrick, Chesterton

*Thursdays, 6-7p.m.

*Saturdays 8:30a.m

*2:30-3:30p.m.

Pope Francis also asks that we enter the spirit of this Holy Year by being instruments of mercy. He suggest that we focus on the Corporal and Spiritual works of Mercy.
