On April 11, 2015, Pope Francis announced a Year of Mercy (December 8, 2015-November 20, 2016) with the publication of a bull of indic-tion, *Misericordiae Vultus* [The Bull of Indiction of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy]. For your edification, I have included the first paragraph of Pope Francis's reflect on our heavenly Father's gift of mercy. If you wish to read the full "letter" simply go to the Vatican website and follow the links to papal Bulls.

Misericordiae Vultus:

Jesus Christ is the face of the Father's mercy. These words might well sum up the mystery of the Christian faith. Mercy has become living and visible in Jesus of Nazareth, reaching its culmination in him. The Father, "rich in mercy" (Eph 2:4), after having revealed his name to Moses as "a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithful-ness" (Ex 34:6), has never ceased to show, in various ways throughout history, his divine nature. In the "fullness of time" (Gal 4:4), when everything had been arranged according to his plan of salvation, he sent his only Son into the world, born of the Virgin Mary, to re-veal his love for us in a definitive way. Whoever sees Jesus sees the Father (cf. Jn 14:9). Jesus of Nazareth, by his words, his actions, and his entire person[1] reveals the mercy of God.
