Last month we reviewed the types of motions. This month we'll take a look at the precedence of motions.

In the following chart, these symbols are used:

- InSp – may interrupt speaker
- NSR – no second required
- ND – not debatable
- LD – limited debate
- 2/3 – requires 2/3 vote for adoption
- OMQ – opens main question to debate

- Motions that bring a question again before the assembly and Incidental Motions have no order of precedence among themselves

Some of these motions are pretty obscure except in very formal proceedings – don't worry about it. What I hope you will remember is the precedence and rules for disposing of or amending a main motion.
