Looking through the membership of this council to find a single family that stands out for our family of the year recognition is no easy task. She is a greeter, lector and Eucharistic Minister. Both were active in the couple to couple program assisting couples preparing for marriage (an alternative to engaged encounter). The Chapel was constructed in 1870 and was the first Roman Catholic Church in Arizona. A portion of the roof collapsed in the 1970s. The restoration project was undertaken when Bishop Green, upon learning that restoration was architecturally possible, refused to permit its demolition. PARLI AMENTARY PROCEDURE – SI MPLI FI ED – PART I I I

This is the final part of a simple tutorial regarding parliamentary procedure. I will briefly cover when to make the most common motions.

Most of the first part of our business meeting is devoted to reports. We hear the minutes read, reports of the Grand Knight, Admissions, and service programs for example. When applications for

membership or transfer are introduced, a motion is made to accept the candidates. Our by laws provide for secret balloting, so it would be appropriate to make a motion to suspend the rules and direct the Recorder to cast one unanimous ballot accepting the prospective members (pending a favorable report of the admissions committee if needed). This motion requires a second. In actual practice, this is usually abbreviated to moving to accept the members, omitting the suspension of rules part. any member could raise a point of order however and ask that secret ballots be taken. (This same general procedure is followed for officer elections).

During the reports, a member may wish to make a motion to spend money, implement a new program or some other action that requires a vote of the council. There are two cases. First, if the motion is new, it should be made during the new business part of the meeting. Second, if the report is on an item that was tabled or referred to the committee at a previous meeting, it should be brought up under old business. In either case, amounts over \$200 require a written resolution and must be read at two meetings.

Motions to amend etc. may be made any time a motion is on the floor.

During the old and new business part of a meeting, it is good protocol to only ask for the floor when you have a motion to make. Stand and say "I move that ...". Once the motion is seconded, the council may discuss it. No discussion should be made until the motion is made and seconded. (If

you just want to comment about something, wait until the Good of The Order or consult with the Grand Knight ahead of the meeting).

In summary, parliamentary procedure is used to assure smooth, fair proceedings. Each member should be familiar with the basics of when and how to make motions. Officers, especially chair officers, should know these basics and be familiar with Robert's Rules of Order.

Finally, the legal print: If anything I have said in this series is in conflict with our Constitution, Laws and Rules, our council by laws or any other higher authority, then they are probably right and I am probably wrong.
